all the final reports will be received and I will hand the gavel over to our incoming DG Lion Omer Champigny.





I have had several phone calls and emails, asking for help to complete the reports to LCI and the district. I have worked on my computer and they on theirs at the same time with great success. Thoughts from the 5M13 District Governor Elect Lion Omer Champigny

Delegating:

Modeling effective leadership yourself: (role model)

Do you model the following practices in order to develop an effective leader?

- 1) Challenge to Process,
- 2) Inspire a shared Vision,
- 3) enable others to act,
- 4) Model the way and
- 5) encourage the heart.

Encouraging these new leaders to pursue leadership opportunities and positions will not only benefit the new Lion, it will benefit the sponsor/mentor



as well as the club. New members bring energy and enthusiasm and along with that, new ideas to the club.

In one way or another, we have all something in common, we were all new or young Lions at one time. Someone mentored us and encouraged us to take on more responsibilities. It is now our turn to pass on our wealth of knowledge and experience to the new generation.
