The Lions Club International lifted the ban on women joining, in 1987.

Before that, it was a men's only group. In 1975, the Lioness emblem and name were approved and membership was open to any lady, whether or not she was married to a Lion. Now however, there is a push to reach parity in numbers of male/ female members, which the Lions hope to achieve by 2017, the year the Lions reach their 100th anniversary.

One of the highlights of the Lions Convention in Virden was a Hall of Fame award to the co-chair of the convention.

For District 5M13, Lion Rick Plaisier was voted in by the district council, and will travel to Minneapolis in mid-April, where he will be honoured as a Hall of Fame recipient.

In an interview, a very pleased Plaisier called the nomination "a real surprise."

For many years Plaisier has worked hard with the Lions organization. Active in starting new Lions Clubs, including the Oak Lake Club, which began over 25 years ago. He also worked with Phillip Hi Eagle to start Clubs in Canupawakpa and in Waywayseecappo. These reservation based clubs were unsuccessful, he says regretfully.

From serving as President of Oak Lake Lions, Plaisier went on to fill many roles in the District. He served as Governor, sat on committees and chaired organizations within the Lions, such as the Leos (youth organization within the Lions Club), he was the student exchange chair, as well as membership chair.

"They regard me as the Grandfather of the Lions Club



– I've been on Cabinet over 20 years," Plaisier smiles softly.

This award was recognition for Plaisier's countless hours of helping others. "I love to give people the opportunity to develop their leadership skills," he says.

He is conscious of his own leadership role and the opportunity this affords to provide a positive leadership model.

People are encouraged as leaders in the Lions

Club by "allowing them to be themselves, to gain self confidence so they can get up and speak, to develop organizational skills," Plaisier explains.

Communication skills are very important says the leader. He participated in the judging of the youth speak-off this weekend, as one of the questioners. "I love to see a young person gaining confidence – it's very rewarding for me," says the Hall of Famer.

Lulu the Hearing Ear Dog Guide

Lulu is a six-year-old Lions Foundation Dog Guide. She is invaluable to her owner, Jocelynn Johnson, a deaf woman from Steinbach.

Johnson explained the value of her dog Lulu to the Lions members attending the District Convention in Virden on February 21. Johnson's husband, Adrian, interpreted for her.

The deaf woman relies on her dog to be her ears and to communicate with her.

There are things the public needs to realize about service dogs.

Johnson explains, "They are tools. You can call the owner and when the dog responds, it can be petted as a reward." But

she adds that people should always check with the dog's handler/owner.

It is vital that the service dog be allowed every place its person must go, with the exception of sterile environments, like hospitals.

Under the Service Dog Act (<https://web2.gov.mb.ca/bills/39-3/b238e.php>) there are questions that cannot be asked of someone with a service dog at their side, such as, 'can't you leave the dog outside? Or 'What is your disability?'

Johnson explains there are questions that, say a store owner for example, can ask, such as, 'Is that a real service dog? What tasks does the dog perform?'

She says, "My response usually depends on whether it was a polite, or not so polite

question."

To avoid questions and confusion with the public, Lulu wears a harness bearing the identification badge of the training company.

In traffic, watch out for service dogs and their person. There are stiff penalties for impeding or interfering with a service dog - up to a \$10,000 fine, plus damages if the dog is injured.

To get Johnson's attention, call her name. When Lulu hears, 'Jocelynn, Jocelynn,' the dog moves to her owner and noses her gently. She is then supposed to lead Johnson to the one who called her.

Door bells and phone calls illicit the same response. A fire alarm however creates much more excitement - the dog spins and is quite animated for this emergency.

Johnson says that different people have different reasons for getting a dog guide.

"Mine was primarily safety," she says and she explains, "When I was in university I was sitting on the second floor studying by myself, and being completely deaf, I was pretty oblivious to what was going around me.... I was in my study phase, until this guy grabbed my arm and started shouting at me. I had to get him to take off his fireman's helmet so I could actually understand him telling me that there was a fire in the restaurant underneath me. There were fire alarms going



off, and apparently people had evacuated the area, but no one had thought to tell me because no one around me knew I was deaf."

She says the adage, 'you can't teach an old dog new tricks' doesn't apply to these dogs. "I'm constantly teaching Lulu new things. Recently during the cold snap, my garage door stopped opening properly, and I trained Lulu to tell me when the key pad beeps, signifying the garage door is opening properly, so I don't need to keep going around the corner and checking," tells Johnson, adding, "Simple things make life easier in -40 Celsius weather."

The life of a service dog is demanding. Johnson says, "Lulu is almost always on duty and has a lot of rules, like not letting people pet her, or not letting her on the furniture."

Once the dog reaches 10 years of age, it can no longer be considered a service dog and must retire. Although Lulu's handler can keep her, she cannot receive a new dog guide if there is already a dog in the home.

There is a list of people waiting to adopt these retired dogs; but Lulu's owner indicates, she will not part with Lulu.

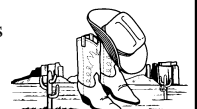

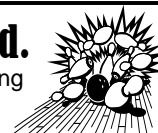
