

Once you've covered all your membership, change to the question to "Why are you grateful / thankful for being a Lion?" This should take up 5 minutes of your meeting, not a half hour. I encourage you to do this exercise at the start of the meeting to create positive momentum for the rest of the meeting.

Have you ever thought of a great idea, but were too scared to bring it up at a meeting because you know that the idea will be YOUR project. Why not create an IDEA JAR; Every Lion writes down a service project or fundraising idea and puts that idea in the jar. Once

you have completed your New Business portion of the meeting, have your President pull two ideas out of the jar and be prepared to discuss them. Remember, that person is in the room, so the old adage "we tried this before and it failed" isn't the answer. Spend a couple of minutes using positive language to discuss the idea, and see where it goes!

Remember Lions – The only reason we must think outside the box is because we created the box in the first place!
