Important Changes Revised Supsension Policy set by Lions Clubs International

Hello Lions! You asked and we are delivering! At the last Lions in Crisis Meeting it was brought to our attention that members want to know what is coming across the desks of our Executive. The Global Leadership Team (Lion Trainers) and the Global Membership Team (District Recruiters) will try to do just that.

Some important changes have occurred over the year with policy both at the International level and the District level.

First is the Revised Suspension Policy set by Lions Clubs International. The bottom line is that the payment policy has changed from 120 days to 90 days.

In laymen terms, your dues must be paid no later than Sept. 29 and March 29 semi-annually.

The **repercussions** of late payment are **VERY serious**. The first offence will place your club

into suspension. This means your club cannot:

- a) Conduct service activities b) Conduct fund raising activi-
- c) Participate in district and multiple district functions or seminars;
- d) Participate in any voting procedures outside of the club
- e) Endorse or nominate a candidate for district, multiple district and international office; f) Submit Monthly Membership Report and report forms; g) Sponsor a Lions club, or organize a Leo or a Lioness club.

Any club not paying their dues on time more than twice will not be allowed to have their club charter reinstated.

The District also amended its Constitution and Bylaws to reflect the changing times.

Email and texting can now be used to entertain motions and voting.

This change makes motions sent by email or text binding.

Should a motion be sent by this method, Lions have no more than 5 business days to respond to the motion, and the Secretary of the club must account for all "for and against" votes.
