Revised Suspension Policy

The Board of Directors amended the suspension policy that affects clubs that have not paid their club balances in a timely manner.

A Club which has an unpaid balance in excess of US\$20 per member or US\$1,000 per club, whichever is less, outstanding past 120 days will be automatically suspended including the charter, rights, privileges, and obligations of the Lions Club. In the event, the Club does not reach an active status by the 28th day of the month following suspension; their charter would be automatically cancelled.

Beginning July 1, 2015, clubs will automatically be placed on Financial Suspension if balances beyond 90 days are equal to or exceeding US\$20/ member or \$1,000 or greater, and cancellation will occur after the 28th day of the month following suspension if full payment is not received. As a result, anticipated high suspension will be reported in October and April. Also, clubs cancelled more than twice will be ineligible for reactivation.

Suspension is the temporary deferment of the charter, rights, privileges and obligations of a Lions club due to an unpaid balance.

Clubs on suspension shall not:

- Conduct service activities
- Conduct fund raising activities;
- Participate in district and multiple district functions or seminars;
- Participate in any voting procedures outside of the club
- Endorse or nominate a candidate for district, multiple district and international office;
- Submit Monthly Membership Report and report forms;
- Sponsor a Lions club, or organize a Leo or a Lioness club.

Clubs on Suspension shall:

- Hold meetings to discuss the future of the club and identify the steps needed to regain an active status.
- Make Payments to clear the existing outstanding balance, or request a payment plan.

This amended policy has serious consequences for clubs that are in arrears in paying their club balances. To rectify this past due condition, clubs placed on suspension may regain an active status by paying the balance in review and update the membership roster after a Club is released from Suspension. Greetings to everyone. We are well into the second month of our Lion's year, time really flies.

The visit to Hawaii for the DGE training and the International Convention was very impressive. Being part of a group of 18,000 Lions from countries around the world certainly makes one become more aware of the immense size of the organization and the great things that are being done by Lions around the world.

There was around 740 DGE's there for training. My group consisted of 29 DGE's from Canada, United States, Thailand, India, Israel, Pakistan, Bulgaria, Lithuania and Macedonia. Working with a group of this nature was in itself a great experience. The youngest DGE in our group was 36, we won't mention the oldest.

In July there was a Council of Governors meeting in St. Cloud, Minnesota.

Many of the discussions and reports centered on activities that affect the Minnesota Clubs as they form the largest part of our Multiple District.

Lion Bill McKittrick gave us an excellent report on The Lions Foundation of Canada - Dog Guides. In the past year 28 Canine Vision, 22 Service Assistance, 24 Hearing Assistance, 12 Seizure Response, 53 Autism Assistance and 5 Diabetic Assistance Dogs have graduated. Let's keep up our support of this great work.

Lion Chris Barnard submitted a report from the Lions Eye Bank and Lions Foundation of Manitoba and North West Ontario. We have

recycled over 1.6 million pairs of eyeglasses since we started the operation. We have four one-bedroom apartments in the Lions Manor on Sherbrook Street in Winnipeg for people from rural Manitoba to use when they come in for medical treatments, etc. The occupancy rate has been 98%.

Our Children's Hearing Research center has recently opened and we have already worked with 36 families. Your continuing support improves the lives of so many.

WHAT ABOUT 5M13?

I am looking forward to visiting with you. Because of the traveling distance and the limited budget, LCI has suggested that two or more clubs combine to organize a visit. I hope this will be possible and we can have a fun evening.

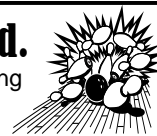

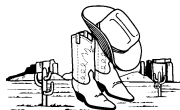

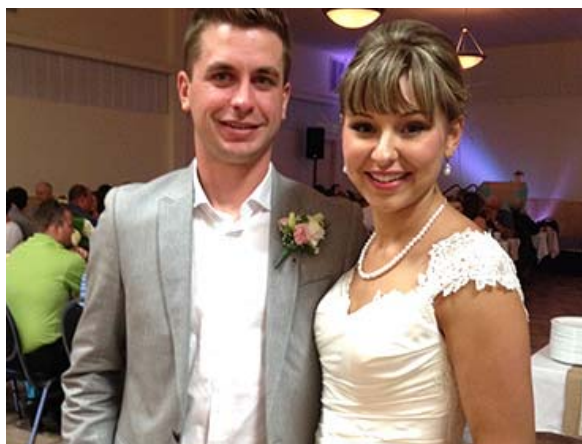

"It's a win-win. We raise money and we help out the environment," says Barry O'Grady, treasurer for the Virden Lions Club.
