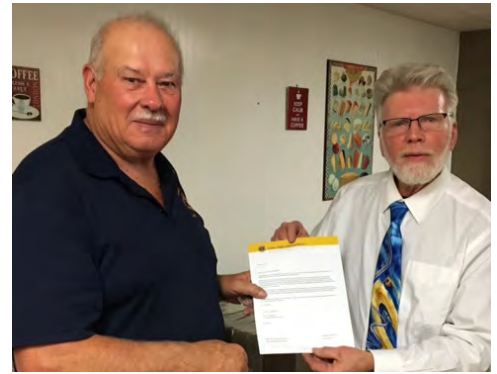
The Quest program has now got a good informational foothold and there will be more activity on that level come fall.

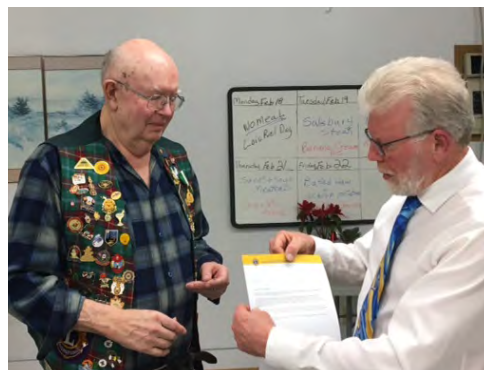

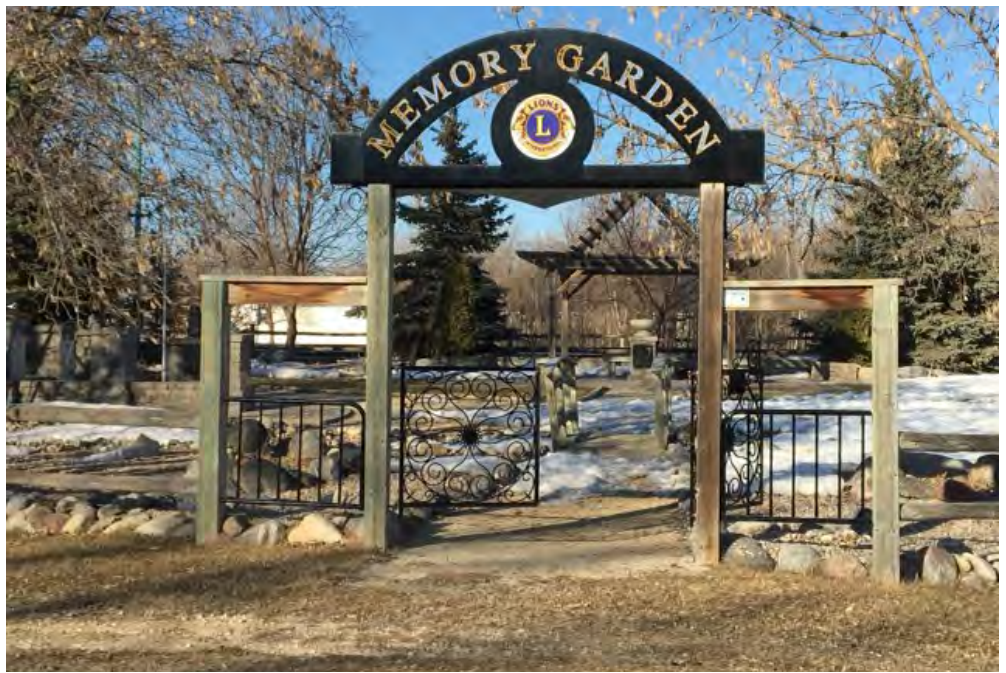

Every two minutes a child is diagnosed with cancer

Lions answering the call with the KidSight Program

Have you heard Brianna's story? If not, I would like to tell you. Brianna is a little girl who had a tumour in her eye. This was discovered at a Lions KidSight eye screening in Connecticut. Thanks to an early detection she now has a prosthetic eye and is enjoying good health. Lion clubs in Manitoba are working towards offering early screening for children in schools to detect problems with their vision they may not be aware of so a referral can be made to an optometrist. The Lions do not diagnose vision problems, only that one does exist so they may be referred to a professional.

I was touched by Brianna's story and have made childhood cancer my cause this year. It is our duty as adults to protect children until they are of age to do so for themselves. They have their whole lives ahead of them and I am saddened when I hear of a child being diagnosed with cancer.

Every cell in the body has a system that controls its growth, interaction with other cells, and even its life span. When certain cells lose that control and grow in a way that the body can no longer regulate, it's called cancer.

Cancer is uncommon in children, but can happen. The most common childhood cancers are leukemia, lymphoma and brain cancer. As children enter their teen years, bone cancer is more common.

Most of the time, doctors don't know why kids get cancer. The things that cause cancer in children are usually not the same ones that cause cancer in adults, such as smoking or exposure to environmental toxins. Children who have had chemotherapy or radiation treatment for cancer are more likely to get cancer again.

The main goal when treating kids with cancer is to cure them. This takes priority over everything else, even if it means unwanted side effects as a result of treatment. In Brianna's case it was losing her own eye to a prosthetic. Thankfully, many medicines and therapies can make children more comfortable while undergoing treatment for cancer.

In the last 40 years, the overall survival rate for children's cancer has increased from 10% to nearly 90% today, but for many more rare childhood cancers, the survival rate is much less. 12% of children who are diagnosed with cancer do not survive.

Chances are that your child will not get cancer: the odds of your child developing cancer by the age of 19 is approximately 1 in 330. But, cancer is second only to accidents as a cause of death in children.

Children are a gift to the world, yet every two minutes a child is diagnosed with cancer and less than half the world's children have access to effective care. Children who survive cancer are often left with debilitating effects that can impact their physical development and ability to learn. That's why Lions and Leos are answering the call to expand access to life saving treatment with the KidSight Program.

Childhood cancer is a global initiative of Lions International.

Kids are pretty special; our concern as Lions is to not have children get sick with cancer and pushes us to be involved in fundraising projects to raise cancer research funds.

Thank you for your attention and please consider becoming involved as every child deserves a second chance in life

Lions Foundation of Canada-Dog Guides

160 teams expected in this years graduation

The Lions Foundation of Canada-Dog Guides had another very good year, but we are not quite the record selling numbers of last year, 203 teams.

By the end of June 2019 we anticipate having graduated 160 Teams which brings the total since the beginning to just under 3,000 Teams in our seven programs. The newest program is "Support Dog Guides" which are used by professional agencies in traumatic situations as the dogs provide comfort to victims who have witnessed a sudden crime or tragedy. To date the school has graduated three dogs, Ontario, Alberta and New Brunswick. Next year the projected goal for graduate team is 180.

The biggest reason for the lower number of teams graduated is the number of qualified trainers who were off on maternity and parental leave, as many of the trainers are young, also the limited space at the present facility. Discussions are on going regarding a solution to the space issue.



Crystal City Lions Dog Walk raised \$1280.

The Pet Valu Dog Walk is one of our biggest fund raising events, and totally sponsored by Pet Valu, and last year there were over 300 locations and walks across Canada raising over \$1,250,000 for the cause. There were 12 walks involving 16 clubs. I would like to see more clubs host a walk on this National Walk Day on May 26, whether they do it individually or join with neighbouring clubs. The Foundation provides all printed materials and advertising and also treat bags for the dogs participating. They will also promote in your local newspaper if you wish. Local Clubs only have to provide the venue and promote

it and get participants to attend and get sponsors. This is a fun day, good fund raiser and very little work for the club. THINK ABOUT IT LIONS!!!!

I would like to thank everyone who supports the Dog Guides Programs and encourage all to become involved in this very worthwhile program to improve the lives of individuals needing assistance for them selves or their chil-

dren, all across Canada.

ID Don Noland was a delight to host – what a wonderful presentation of Lionism – so personable – so easy going and such a pleasure to be in his company.

Some of the highlights of the Convention for me was the number of Speak Off participants that came out – 11 in all – so thrilled to see so many young people taking up this challenge. It was also very heartwarming to hear the stories from Heather Valentine & Tracy Dexlar who spoke how Dog Guides has changed their families lives. Moments like those lift the spirit and renew the energy for what we do "SERVE".

We were taken by total surprise with the presentation given by Tina & Aaron Knockaert – this is NOT what we were led to believe this was about.

One of the biggest struggles that we faced was the funding for Convention. This is the second Convention that I have chaired. With the first one, we had the support of the Brandon Lions Club who worked so diligently to solicit sponsorships. With this second convention, we had the support of the Erickson Lions Club.

For a small Club to consider hosting Convention, this is the biggest challenge they face. Our Business Community supports us with so many of our fundraising events and activities. Convention is a time for Lions to come together to renew our energy and get excited about who we are and what we do! It needs to be supported by its members.

This was one of the major reasons that we chose to try something new – 50/50 tickets. It was our hope that each Club would support Convention by purchasing one book of tickets for \$100. If every Club within the District participated, this would generate \$5,300 towards the costs of Convention. This gives the Convention Committee some 'seed' to get started. It may even encourage other smaller clubs to come forward and host a convention.

It is my understanding that District has included a levy of \$100/Club to help support the Manitoba Lion. I would like to recommend that District consider doing the same to support their convention.

I would like to ask District Cabinet for their assistance in covering the deficit of this convention, \$709.83.

Lastly, I would like to extend my apologies to DG Gareth and Cabinet for the tardiness in which I have presented this report.
