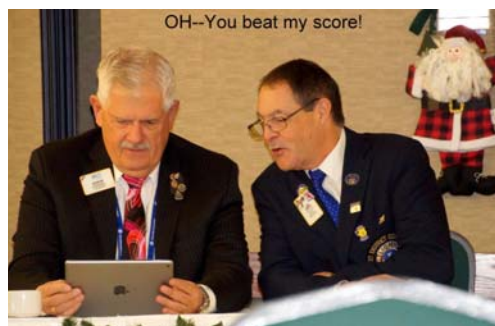

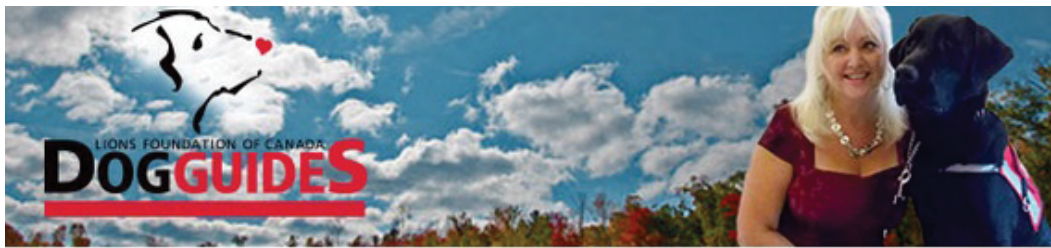

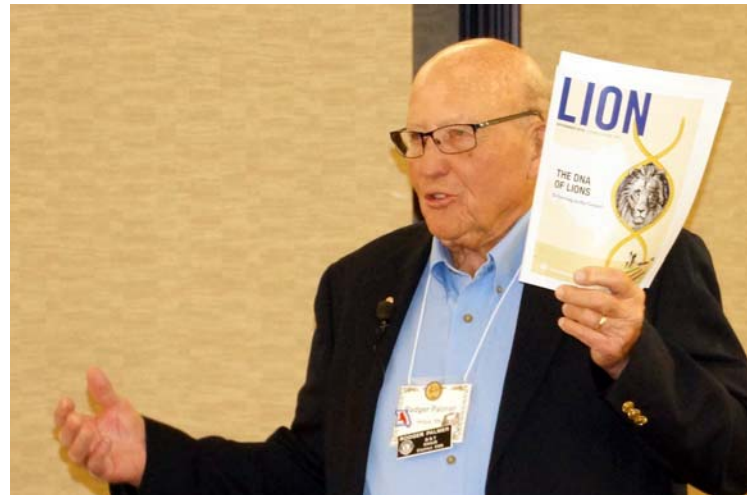

Mikayla Riffel is currently 11 years old in Grade 6 at the Onanole Elementary School.

Mikayla started tab collecting about four years ago. She was very touched by a story that a family friend told her. This friend is a care giver to a little boy from a young family. The boy was not much younger than she was at the time and was confined to a wheelchair. The little guy was growing so fast the family was having a hard time to keep up with the expense of the wheelchair replacement. She thought she had to do something to try to help.

Determination is Mikayla's middle name and the tab collection began that day!

This is 2nd "tab" donation towards the Lions Club she has made. She donated last fall to the Sandy Lake Lions Club approximately 25 lbs.

She enjoyed meeting the Lions and felt so honoured with the time and appreciation that they presented her with the Medal of Hope award. She considered that an honour which she continues to cherish.

This year she donated over 125 lbs of tabs, that she has collect-

ed. 100 lbs more than last year. The "haul of tabs" filled the entire back of her Mom's SUV. Her Dad is happy that he has the reclaimed space in his garage but knows that it will be soon filled up with probably MORE tabs next year.

Mikayla has decided to spear head this task in Onanole but she knows that she has NOT done this alone and has had the help of her wonderful community.

She wishes to specifically thank her family and friends, the OHL team, The Clear Lake Golf course, Bruce Babcyh-Wildlife committee, The McMillan Family, Scot Shellborn and countless others who keep dropping tabs by her house.

There is one very special person from Dauphin who didn't give her / his name, all she knows is he is a Dr. from Dauphin and has collected for almost 30 years providing her with approx. 65lbs alone. THANK YOU!

Why should we have a Canadian Executive Officer?

This is a very legitimate question as we ask Individual Lions and their clubs to contribute both time and money to the election process.

I believe we must begin by looking at the reasons we are member of this world-wide organization we call Lions Clubs International. I would suggest that we will find the reasons for membership are quite similar for those of us living in India, Korea, Iceland, Canada or any other of our over 200 countries around the world. Those common reasons are to make our communities and our world a better place in which to live. We Serve!

The very interesting fact of this global fellowship of humanitarians is that there is no mandated or common method to follow in achieving our service goals. We have differing cultural, financial, and political norms that influence our journey to serve.

For these reasons I suggest that it is of great importance to have all these differences represented, over the years, in our international leadership. Each executive officer provides five years of influence in giving direction to the Association. It is to be expected that their culture and beliefs will be reflected in their leadership. It is the melding of these differences that make for a strong global family of Lions. It is important to provide the Canadian perspective to this global development.

It is over 30 years since the world elected Judge Brian Stevenson to serve as International President. Judge Brian has been a strong voice for international service with Canadian values while sharing the values of others that have made Lions Clubs International one of the world's great non-governmental organizations.

Lion Dr. Patti Hill has a professional background in building collaboration and consensus among diverse stakeholders, a skill that she will bring to the executive officer role.

Lion Patti as stated: "I am motivated to help build an effective Association that is readily able to support our individual Lions Clubs. The Association exists to serve Clubs so that Clubs can serve communities, not the other way around."

Since 1985, Dr. Hill has provided consulting services to hospitals, school boards, government departments, and private individuals and agencies across western Canada.

Dr. Hill has taught in Alberta and California. She is a teacher, a certified teacher of the deaf and hard of hearing, a registered psychologist, and a former principal and post-secondary instructor.

Students at the University of Alberta, Grand MacEwan Community College, Pembina Consortium and Red Deer Community College have benefited from Dr. Hill's expertise. Dr. Hill has mentored more than twenty graduate students from the University of Alberta's Deaf Education and Educational Psychology programs, City University and Yorkville University. She has supervised numerous Provisionally Registered Psychologists completing their residency hours.

Dedicated to serving her profession, Dr. Hill served on the Executive of the Alberta School Psychologist Association. In addition, she has served as a contributor to the Alberta Premier's Council on the Status of Persons with Disabilities.

Currently, Dr. Hill is the owner of a consulting firm, working with schools, families, and government agencies to design and support programs and interventions for special needs children and students. The goal: enabling others to excel.
