# THIRD QUARTER REVIEW

We have competed 3/4ths of our Lions Year. The Goals for the District recommended by the District Governors Team were:

New Members from Existing Clubs: 115 Chartered New Clubs: Three

With 75 Charter Members and only 67 Dropped Members.

Instead, we have not Chartered any New Clubs, so we are short 75 new members. On March 31, 2013 our District had: New Members: 55, or short of goal by 60 Dropped Members: 81 or 14 over goal. March 31, 2013 Membership Total: 854.

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, I was informed that Lions International President Wayne Madden had awarded Bronze Winners Circle Certificates to the District Governors of 3-O, 3-L, and myself as DG of 3-H. Of course, we Governors are representing our Districts because this award is earned by the Clubs in each District. The Bronze Winners Circle award represents Districts that have a loss in members this year, but that loss in membership is less that is was last year. This award covers the period of July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012.

I want to thank all the Clubs of District 3-H for your efforts in recruiting new members and dropping fewer members.

If all of us strive to recruit new members to where each club brings in one more new member than the number dropped, we might win the Gold Medal for the year.
