STATE POSITIONS

As per Oklahoma Lions Constitution and the Governors Council Policy the First Vice District Governors will be accepting application for the following State Positions for their year of Governorship 2013 - 2014: Council Chairperson, Vice Council Chairperson, State Secretary, State Treasurer and Parliamentarian.

A letter of intent to serve and qualifications should be addressed to each First Vice District Governor, Council Chairman Marvin Ainsworth and the Oklahoma Lions State Office. <u>Final deadline for</u> <u>application will be March 8, 2013</u>. Interviews for said positions will be conducted by the then District Governors Elect at the conclusion of their training March 23, 2013. Final decisions will be announced at the closing of the State Convention April 27, 2013. The following is from State Constitution:

ARTICLE IV COUNCIL OF GOVERNORS

SECTION 1. OFFICERS The officers of this Multiple District shall be members of the Multiple District Council of Governors, which shall be composed of the District Governors and Chairperson who shall be selected in accordance with Article IV Section 3.

SECTION 2. ORGANIZATION The District Governors-elect shall meet during the Multiple District (State) Convention and organize by electing a Council Chairperson, Vice Council Chairperson, State Treasurer, State Secretary and conducting such other business as shall be necessary. The Council Chairperson, Vice Council Chairperson, State Secretary, State Treasurer, Office Secretary, and any additional state employees shall be given written job descriptions, which may be modified or updated by any Council of Governors. In the event the Council determines that the elected Council Chairperson is unable to perform his/her duties, the Council shall appoint the Vice Council Chairperson as the acting Co Chairperson. The Vice Council Chairperson has no official duties, responsibilities, authority or vote until the Council has declared him/her to be Council Chairperson.

SECTION 3. ELECTED POSITIONS (a). The Council Chairperson shall be a Past District Governor who has served within the past 5 years and shall be elected for a one-year term and shall not serve in that capacity again. (b). The Vice Council Chairperson shall be a Past District Governor who has served in that office within the past 5 years. A Vice Council Chairperson who has served for a majority of a term as Council Chairperson may not serve in that capacity again.

"White Cane" we do to serve?

First off, I would like to apologize for the bad pun in the title. Sometimes, I just can't help myself (I'm a card; I should be dealt with!). With that said, it is time for **White Cane**! For those of you unfamiliar with the **White Cane** fundraising campaign, and all that it symbolizes, here is a little history (which you can find in greater detail on the LCI website):

In 1921, James Biggs, a photographer in Bristol, England, lost his vision in an accident. Feeling uncomfortable with the amount of traffic around his home, he painted his walking stick white to make it more visible. Building off this idea, Lion George A. Bonham, president of the Peoria Lions Club in Illinois, added a red band to the **White Cane** in 1930. He introduced the cane as a means to assist the blind with independent mobility. His club approved the idea, and the **White Cane** with the red stripe was produced and distributed. Soon, the Peoria City Council adopted an ordinance giving the bearers of the cane the right-of-way to cross the street. News quickly spread to other Lions Clubs throughout the nation, and the **White Cane** achieved overwhelming acceptance as a unique way to identify the special travel needs of the visually impaired.

This idea gained footing internationally in 1931 when Guilly d'Herbemont of France launched a national "white stick movement" for blind people and donated 5,000 **White Canes** to people in Paris. Today, **White Cane** laws are on the books of every state in the US, and in many countries as well, providing visually impaired people a legal status in traffic. The **White Cane** now universally symbolizes that the bearer is blind.

On October 6, 1964, in an effort to make Americans more aware of the meaning of the **White Cane** and the need for motorists to exercise special care for the person who carries it, the US Congress approved a resolution authorizing the President of the US to annually issue a proclamation designating October 15th as **National White Cane Safety Day**. Since that time, the National Federation for the Blind (NFB), a leading organization for the blind, has established the third week in May as **White Cane Week**. During this week, a special concentration of efforts to educate the public concerning the hopes and aspirations of the blind is emphasized. In keeping with the Lions' established tradition of assisting the blind, many Lions clubs used this time to raise funds for sight-related projects.

Over the years, this program has become a Spring staple of Lions Clubs throughout the world. Most participating clubs hold their events in March, April, or May. In Oklahoma, this fundraising event has evolved into one of the Oklahoma Lions Service Foundation's largest fundraisers in support of both the Oklahoma Lions Eye Bank and the Oklahoma Lions Boys Ranch. Through the hard work and dedication of the Lions Clubs throughout the state, we hope to continue this tradition of service. Last year, only 25% of the clubs throughout the state participated, and \$24,000 was raised. Imagine what we could do if even 50% of the clubs participated!

Letters from each District Governor and the White Cane Committee member from each district have been sent to every club in the state asking for participation in this year's campaign. We are still working on some details to give the campaign some cohesion throughout the state, but would like to start by asking you to select a chair from your club to head up your efforts. As with anything we do, we will achieve greater success with greater participation. So if your club typically participates in **White Cane**, thank you! We look forward to working with you again! If your club does not typically participate, or has fallen out of the habit, please consider joining us this year! Working together, we can accomplish more. With everybody's help, we will continue to live up to our motto – **We Serve!**




