The 3-H Alert (Disaster Relief) Team, chaired by 1st VDG Jacque Mooney, as part of the Lions of Oklahoma team, continues to work in relief of the May 2013 tornados. Most recently, we allocated funds to furnish and equip the Education Center for the Moore Medical Center (including five Spot Vision Testers).

In 3-H, the focus has shifted to addressing individual needs that are still unmet, working with other agencies to provide funding for some of these, with the preference given to the elderly and un- or under-insured.

The most pressing need within the district is to identify liaisons from each club willing to serve when the next disaster comes. Please reach out to the DG team if you are interested.

Club Spotlight: Harrah Lions Club

Harrah, 25 miles east of Oklahoma City, with a population over 5,000, is the home of the Harrah Lions Club, chartered in September 1962. The Lions Park in Harrah is no longer the town's premiere park but is located in a quiet neighborhood by one of the Harrah school buildings. The Lions continue to be involved in the maintenance of the park by the City of Harrah.

Louis Navarre, a Potawatomi tribal member, arrived in the area in the early 1870's to hunt but soon settled there permanently on land which was later sold to Frank Harrah. Harrah plotted the original town site. Other settlers arrived following the land opening of the Sac and Fox, Iowa, Potawatomi and Absentee Shawnee Tribal Nations on September 22, 1891.

E. W. Sweeney operated a ferry across the

North Canadian River and later built a wooden pontoon toll bridge, located about a quarter of a mile east of Harrah's current bridge crossing on Highway 62. Polish immigrants arrived in 1892. On May 23, 1895 Kickapoo lands were opened. The railroad was established starting in April 1889. Earlier names for the town were Pennington and Sweeney, but the post office name was changed to Harrah on December 22, 1898.

Actor Dale Robertson was born in Harrah in 1923. Baseball Hall of Famer Paul Waner was also born in Harrah; he and his brother Lloyd hold the career record for hits by brothers.

The Harrah Lions interact closely with both the school system and the community. Their latest combination service and fundraising project boosts the town's spirit and patriotic pride; that project,

of course, is the U. S. flag display for both businesses and residents in Harrah. With over 100 subscriptions, you can immediately see the influence of the Harrah Lions when you drive High-

way 62 (OKC NE 23rd St.) or any of the residential neighborhoods on any one of five to seven flag-flying holidays.

Led by President Gary Fitzgerald, the Harrah Lions are the parent club of the Choctaw-Nicoma Park branch Lions Club, and will be the sponsoring club once that branch club grows enough to charter, surely by early Fall 2014.

Past District Governor Joe Ray and Lion Jonita Thomas as well as Lion Ray Kerchee are long-time supporters of the Oklahoma Lions state office. Both Joe Ray and Jonita have spent their "retirement" years in working at the State of Oklahoma Capitol. Lions Joe Ray Thomas and Ray Kerchee are retired from Harrah Public Schools.

Last but not least, Lion Kathy makes wonderful homemade vanilla ice cream! And Lion Chuck Ferguson will do a great job in tail twisting this year at the Harrah Lions Club meetings.

We Serve!

Spot it Early by CC Tom Cummings

For years, Lions Clubs of Oklahoma have been known for our vision programs of recycling used eyeglasses and helping those financially in need with vision exams and purchasing eyeglasses.

We now are on the verge of adding a new program with the potential to make the Lions of Oklahoma known for their vision screening of children from six-months to eight-years old. Why do we need to do this? According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention vision disability is the single most prevalent disabling condition among children. Additional studies by the



metric Association found that 70% of children diagnosed with a learning disability have a vision issue, and only

a third of kids have had a vision screening by the time they enter kindergarten. These are national statistics; I would venture a guess that the Oklahoma statistics are even higher.

So, there is the problem and here is the solution. Oklahoma Lions, armed with Spot cameras, going to preschools, daycares and kindergartens to screen the kids in our communities.

These will be screenings very much like those health screenings done in our Mobile Health Screening Unit. This is not a diagnosis; it is a screening. The child looks at the Spot camera and it takes an image of the child's eyes with measurements and a preliminary evaluation. Both will be printed on the accompanying printer, indicating that the measurements are either within or outside the normal range. In the event the results are outside of the norm, a follow -up with a doctor is recommended. The child takes the printout home to their parents. Each child's screening takes only about two minutes.

The camera and printer will be in a case. The forms for the school and parents will be available in a Microsoft Word file allowing customization with the club's name.

We have been trying to establish this program for over a year; finally all the pieces are falling into place. We are partnering with the Moore Medical Center (destroyed in the May 2013 tornado) in furnishing their new educational/safety room. As part of this LCIF grant, we will have five Spot camera system

"kits" (including the camera, the printer, and the case) that will be available to all District 3-H

Lions District 3-H is one of five districts in Multi-District 3 (Oklahoma). Located in central Oklahoma, the district covers Cleveland, Logan, Lincoln, **Oklahoma**, and Payne Counties, and includes one club in Kingfisher County. 3-H includes the following Lions Clubs: Carney, Cashion, Chandler, Crescent, Cushing (and the Yale branch club), Davenport, Edmond, Guthrie, Harrah (and the **Choctaw/Nicoma Park branch** club), Langston City, Midwest City, Morrison, Mulhall-Orlando, Norman, Norman Sooner, OKC Capitol Hill, OKC Downtown, OKC Northwest (and the OKC Community Helpers branch club), **OKC West Side, Perkins, Perry,** Prague, Stillwater Noon (and the Stillwater eLions branch club), Stroud, and The Village.

our clubs for screenings in their schools and communities.

Lions, this can be a fantastic opportunity for our clubs to meet needs of our children. We hope to have these kits available for clubs by October.

This is a brief explanation of the system and the program. You will be hearing more very soon.
