

#### SPECIAL CONVENTION CALLED

#### LIONS OF OKLAHOMA MD-3

Saturday, January 9, 2016 approx.. 2:30pm OKC West Side Town Hall

The Council of Governors of MD-3 Oklahoma moved to petition LCI to postpone the redistricting to begin July 1, 2017 rather than July 1, 2016, and to change the naming of the three (3) new districts. LCI advised that in order for this to take place we need to hold a Special Convention to allow the MD-3 membership to vote on both of these issues. LCI further advised that we need to give the membership a 60 day notice of the special convention for the voting. After the voting results have been determined, the Council will need to file a resolution with the LCI Board prior to March 5, 2016 (date of the next LCI Board of Directors Meeting) for the Board to take action on the two issues.

As it stands now, LCI will only recognize three (3) District Governors from MD-3 for the LCI Governor training in June, and we currently have five (5) who are in line to serve. Given this information, plus the necessity for each of the four (4) Boards (OLEB, OLBR, OLSF & Briggs) and the three new districts who must revise/create their Constitution and By-Laws, the later date of July 1, 2017 is all but required. It is the Council's recommendation that the delegates in attendance select the 2017 date. The Council asks that each club send delegates to the Special Convention to vote.

In summary, we will be voting on two separate issues:


- 1. Change effective date for implementation of redistricting plan to July 1, 2017, this will be a Yes / No vote.
- 2. Select Option 1 or Option 2 (AS SHOWN ON REVERSE SIDE) for the naming of the three (3) new districts.


Lions of Oklahoma MD-3 have always been a stronghold of dedicated Lions and we want to continue with that tradition. If you have any questions, please contact your District Governor.


**Pauls Valley:** got together last week and helped decorate our downtown depot area with Christmas lights.





- 1. Each Lion may submit only **one entry**. The Club may submit an entry as a group effort, or hold a club contest of individuals designs selecting the representative design.
- 2. All entries must be received NLT March 1, 2016 mail all entries to Lions of Oklahoma at, 4123 NW 10th St, OKC 73107
- 3. The pin must represent Oklahoma Lions and not an individual area or region
- 4. The design (drawing) will be submitted on an 8 ½ x 11 sheet of paper or art board.
- 5. The design will be no smaller than 3" x 5" or larger than 4" x 6", this will provide the pin company with an adequate sample to produce the pin. Actual size to be determined by the designing company and pin coordinator.
- 6. A short narrative will accompany the design explaining the meaning and color representation
- 7. Only Lions may enter the contest.
- 8. The initial design will be selected by the pin committee and be submitted to the incoming governors at the state convention or their training.
- 9. The winning design will be given to the appropriate pin committee member and sent for final art development and production. Upon receipt of the finished pin the Lions of Oklahoma State office will have them available.
