Summary Report for District 13 OH 7 Zone 8 Rick Howell Zone chair.

Coal Grove Lions Club. The Club has been very active in local activities and projects. These include Breakfast with Santa for over 100 children, Giveaway of Food Baskets at Christmas (45) and Thanksgiving (45) baskets, helping those in need, and two eye exams and purchase of eye glasses for them. They are planning for the "Breakfast with the Easter Bunny" on April 20<sup>th</sup>, "Run Like A Lion" 5K race/walk on May 23<sup>rd</sup>, Golf Scramble in September. They also fund several Lions International Projects. They have a roster of 26 with a 40% average Attendance at meetings They have a potential 3 new members within the next couple months.

Gallipolis Lions club. The has just completed their "Christmas With the Children" serving 110 children with over \$10,000.00 in gifts and food with the Leos wrapping, stuffing Christmas stocking with candy and serving by helping purchase and wrap presents. The Local Police Dept. and Sheriff Dept. assisted be running a Boot drive to collect Money for Project. All three local Leo Clubs (River Valley, GCLC, South Gallia) assisted in the Christmas project, The Club assisted the Gallipolis Community Leos (GCLC) by purchasing Socks for their "Socks for Veterans", Drive, Collected Stuff Toys for the (GCLC) Leos for the Police Dept., assisted a River Valley Senior Leo Member by Donating Diapers, ETC to Holzer Hospital to support her Senior Project. The club has set up exams and purchased glasses/contacts for people in need, funded 10 Humanitarian projects for Lions International. The club is preparing for The Golf Scramble in June, The St. Patrick Day parade, and Special Olympics water giveaway.

The club recently had a membership drive and will potentially take in 2-3 new lions. The Roster carries 36 members with a 55% to 60% average attendance.

Ironton Lions club. The Ironton Club is serving their local community by providing dollars and food to the local food bank, to the City Mission, clothes, toiletries, etc., Working toward Community Glass Recycling Project, and working with and supporting the "Ironton In Bloom" project. They also participate and work with the Memorial Day and Halloween parades. Their Haunted Tunnel Project was a success. (main fund Raiser)

We discussed how to retain and gain new member who would be at meetings. Roster number is 29 with a 20% to 30% average attendance.

Jackson Lions Club. The largest club in the Zone with 59 members and a 50% to 60% average attendance. Is very busy with a load of volunteer work. 57 lions volunteer with over 180 hours of time put into their projects/activities. This includes recycling, maintaining a Blessing Box, Donating and distributing clothes, Historical Society, The Hope Center, Girl Scouts, Lillian Jones Museum, The local Library, United Way org.
