# OHIO LIONS STATE BUILDING TRUSTEES 3<sup>RD</sup> QUARTER REPORT February 8, 2014

Council Chair Forrest Conrad, Jr Council of Governors 2013-14 International Family Members Report # 5

The third quarterly meeting of the Ohio Lions Building Trustees was held on January 22, 2014 at the State Office Building. Trustees were present from 9 of the 10 sub districts. PDG Pete DiCesare was excused due to surgery earlier. DG Tom Zickefoose, DG liaison; PDG Norman Cupps, F&LRP liaison and MDS/PDG Debbie Luttrell were also present.

We are pleased to report that all tenants housed in the Ohio Lions Building are current with their monthly lease payments; in fact, SWEA has paid in advance. We continue to have prospective tenants working with our leasing agent, Ohio Equities, Inc. Ohio Equities has shown the first floor facility to several prospective leases but we have not received any offers to lease the premises at this time.

Following the approval of the trustees' request at the November Council of Governors meeting to remedy our gurgling sink problem, we continued to pursue the resolution of this long running issue. We are disappointed to say that we have been unable to solve this issue due to legal issues that continue to be raised with adjacent property owners. Following much discussion at the recent trustee meeting, we are taking a different approach to try and resolve the issue in-house.

A significant amount of time was dedicated to discussing the future of the current State Office Building over the next five to ten years. A committee had been appointed at our November meeting to begin this analysis and their report opened various items that need to be considered in any long range plan. We will continue to study this far-reaching topic and plan to have a preliminary report available in the near future.

The trustees will begin to develop our proposed budget for the building trustees for the 2014-15 Lions year and expect to have it ready for submission to the F&LRP committee in due time. In the past, we have tried to be very conscious of our income vs expenses, and recognize that it continues to be more difficult to present a balanced budget.

The Building Trustees have presented proposals to F&LRP to paint the interior hallways and stairwells of the building. We have met with different vendors, and Lion Mike Reiger, District H trustee, who is a painting contractor by profession, has reviewed the best proposal and feels it is a very fair proposal.

The Building Trustee positions from four districts are up for election this spring at the sub district conventions of Districts A, D, G and J. I encourage the District Governor from each of those districts to be mindful of the need to hold an election for Building Trustee in their district during their upcoming district convention.

I have the opportunity to personally observe how our contributions have assisted those individuals with sight and hearing disabilities by giving them independence and confidence to become a productive part of our society. The gratitude expressed by those receiving our assistance has brought tears of joy to my eyes on every visitation to the S & H agencies

In 1925 Helen Keller issued her challenge to the Lions to become Knights of the Blind in the crusade against darkness. I often wonder if she had any idea of the ramifications of her challenge. Nobody knows how many millions of individuals with sight and hearing disabilities have experienced the "gift of sight" through our numerous Lions Sight and Hearing projects. Why is our mission so important? Every 11 minutes someone loses their eyesight. Blindness and visual impairment exact a great price from individuals in our society. Vision and hearing loss robs people of their independence, mobility, and quality of life. These impairments are also an enormous cost to society, estimated at over \$60 million annually in Ohio

The MD13 Sight and Hearing committee wishes to thank all the Lions, Lioness, and Leo clubs for their continual support to the Sight & Hearing projects during 2013-2014. As of February 16th, 32 Lions Clubs, 1 Lioness Club, and 3 Leo Clubs have donated over \$9,670 to the Lions Sight & Hearing projects, and we are still counting the contributions. Donations are about the same as year's donations for the same period of time. Currently, Zone 1 is the only Zone in our District which has100% Club contributions to the Ohio Lions Sight & Hearing projects. I would like to have more Leo Clubs sponsor a Sight and Hearing project.
