Thank you for your continued support for LCIF. As of January 26, the total donations received and sent to LCIF total \$25,644.00. Individual Lions have donated \$6,000.00. Your financial support is extremely important to those in need around the world. Our clubs and Lions have designated \$10,264.00 of the total donations to specific hurricanes and the recent wildfires in California. Thanks for your donations to help those who have lost so much in these disasters.

The following are highlights concerning Lions and LCIF efforts in California dealing with the disaster:

- \* LCIF has awarded US\$130,000 in grant funding to support Lions in their relief efforts.
- \* Lions in impacted areas are working hard to assess needs, identify opportunities to assist their communities, and mobilize grant funds.
- \* The Lions of California have quickly established a disaster relief committee and are actively coordinating efforts.

We are again having the Melvin Jones Fellowship fund raiser at our district convention. There are 100 boxes with \$10 for each box. Currently 41 squares are sold with the rest to be sold at the cabinet meeting and district convention. This will be our third year for this fund raiser for LCIF.

The previous two winners of a Melvin Jones Fellowship were Lion Sandra Crow from the Danville Lions Club and Lion Gloria Johnson from the Beverly Lions Club. If the winner is already a Melvin Jones Fellow, they may designate another person or receive a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship.

The Russ Williams Chapter Award which started in 1996 will be given to each club donating \$20.00 per member between January 16, 2024, and January 19, 2025. The club and individual Lions donations in a club are combined to determine the total donation from a club. The Russ Williams Chapter Award clubs are listed and will be recognized at the district convention. All club donors and Lion donors will be recognized with a certificate at the zone meetings in March.

Our speaker, BRUCE BOGUSKI, was in a car accident at the age of 18 and was paralyzed from the neck down. After two years, he regained full use of his body and went on to become a two-time Ohio state champion in racquetball and played on a state championship softball team. He has been a baseball coach and assistant football coach at the high school level, as well as a tennis coach at the college level.

Today, Bruce spends most of his time making speeches throughout North America. He has made over 1,800 presentations to student groups, educators, associations, chambers of commerce, large and small corporations, secretarial groups, and government agencies. Bruce is the author of several books.


