### Mid-Year Membership and Training Update: Let's Build Lionism in Southeastern Ohio Together

My fellow Lions, as we step into the second half of the Lions year, it's the perfect time to reflect on our progress, evaluate where we stand, and renew our commitment to making a difference in our communities. Southeastern Ohio needs Lions more than ever that are willing to serve and bring hope to those who need it most. Together, we can achieve great things by focusing on the needs of our communities and spreading the spirit of Lionism.

#### Membership and Club Officer Training Goals

At the beginning of this Lions year, we set ambitious yet achievable goals to strengthen our district:

- One new club
- 111 new members
- Reduce average drops by 10% (124 or fewer drops for the year)
- Net growth of +1

25% of club officers (president, secretary, and treasurer) completing training

#### Current Status

Here is where we stand today:

- **New Clubs:** While we have not yet chartered a new club, we are actively working in two promising areas.
- **New Members:** We've welcomed **46 new Lions** to our district. Every new Lion represents hope and potential for stronger communities.
- **Member Drops:** Unfortunately, **73 members** have been dropped, leaving us at a net loss of **-21**. While this is a challenge, it's also an opportunity to focus on retention and reengagement.

**Club Officer Training:** We're at **22% completion** for club officer training. We only need **four more officers** to complete their training to meet our goal! This can be done by watching a training video on our district website ([www.OH7Lions.com](http://www.OH7Lions.com)) or completing the officer learning path on the Lions Portal's Learn App.

**Thank you for your continued support for LCIF.** As of December 26, the total donations processed by donor services are \$20,744.00 with the month of November almost complete. One of the eight focus areas of support provided by LCIF is for Childhood Cancer. "Your child has cancer" are four gut-wrenching words no parent ever wants to hear. For many in Wisconsin, those words are linked to the vital services provided at Children's Hospital of Wisconsin. This hospital cares for two-thirds of the state's young cancer patients.

With the number of children needing life-saving bone marrow transplants expected to rise, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin desperately needed additional costly treatment technology. Lions Clubs International Foundation and caring Lions stepped in and provided funding and hope to families in times of utter darkness and doubt.

With a \$100,000.00 Matching grant from LCIF and funds raised locally, the hospital purchased equipment that gives children a better chance to enjoy healthier tomorrows and long productive lives. The hospital's capacity to treat young cancer patients also expanded with the new equipment. Now, an additional 150 children and their families have hope for the future. This matching grant has helped to change children's futures for the better.
