Clubs can apply for reinstatement through the IRS using Form 1024 or 1023-EZ, depending on your situation. Please use the link below to research your club. One of the stops PID Ron and Lion Kitty visited was District 11-E-2 Lions assembling 365 hygiene bags for homeless shelter in norther Michigan.





Thank you for your continued support for LCIF. As of April 25, the total donations received and sent from our district to LCIF total \$34,169.00. Thank you to Lions and Clubs for your donations with Lions donating \$9,005.00 and clubs donating \$25,164.00. Over \$1.3 billion has been awarded in grants since 1968.

Please attend the District Lions Leadership School on May 10th at Alexander High School with many learning opportunities including a class about LCIF.

I am highlighting a couple of LCIF supported projects with one using a District and Club Community Impact Grant like our district has used in the last few years and the other using an LCIF Hunger Grant.

Ohio

The Painesville Lions Club used a District and Club Community Impact Grant of US\$6,503 to help create the five-day Painesville Safety Town training program in collaboration with parks and recreation, public works, police, firefighters and more. In response to recent tragedies with children in the community, this event was introduced to provide incoming kindergarten students with skills in the areas of pedestrian safety, fire safety, bike safety, water safety and train safety. With 20 children participating, 81% of parents felt their child's safety knowledge increased and 90% of parents would recommend the program to others, according to post-event surveys.



Texas

To fight hunger in the Texas counties of El Paso, Hudspeth and Culberson, 12 Lions clubs in District 2-T3 partnered with the El Pasoans Fighting Hunger food bank to purchase a refrigerated semi-truck funded by an LCIF Hunger Grant of US\$100,000. Poverty and lack of access to food sources combine to create great need in these counties. The mobile pantry will serve 450-500 families per week, at 5-12 sites. Area Lions can volunteer for mobile pantry food distributions, directly helping those in need.


ATHENS LIONS CLUB

At Coolville, 11 students were screened for vision health and 3 referrals were made for a professional eye exam. Again thanks to our dedicated screeners:

Screening totals for all five schools tested this Spring:

127 students screened , 16 referrals to an eye professional
14 notifications to parents and school staff on potential for color deficiency, 3 additional referrals by PlusOptix Autorefractor where LEA testing indicating passing results (not currently approved by State of Department of Health - but expected to be approved for next screening standard).






HEBRON LIONS CLUB
