Thank you for the support you continue to provide to LCIF. Our foundation exists to support Lions serving in the eight global causes (Childhood Cancer, Diabetes, Disaster Relief, Environment, Humanitarian, Hunger, Vision and Youth). Donor Services recently closed the month of July with all our District Donations coming from individual Lions. The donations for July totaled \$405.

A reminder that a donation of \$20 per member is needed to receive the Russ Williams Chapter Award for a club. This club recognition was started in 1996 with a requirement of \$10 per member. With almost 30 year of inflation, ten dollars in 1996 would be equal to twenty dollars today. LCIF offers additional levels of recognition for a club which follows:

There are multiple levels of recognition to honor clubs based on their per-member average contributions. The levels are as follows.

All Donors:

Bronze Level - US\$50 per member (within a fiscal year)

Silver Level - US\$100 per member (within a fiscal year)

Gold Level - US\$250 per member (within a fiscal year)

Platinum Level - US\$500 per member (within a fiscal year)

Diamond Level - US\$1,000 per member (within a fiscal year)

District Eyeglass Trailer Challenge!

As you may know, District OH7 has taken an important step in our Eyeglass Recycling efforts by purchasing a trailer for the storage and transportation of the thousands of pairs of glasses that OH7 Lions collect each year. Eyeglass Collection Chair Greg Randolph has brought this trailer to several Zone meetings and it has been a big help in safely moving these glasses. He's already taken it to Pandora a couple of times so far loaded with glasses!

The district has created a fund to pay for the purchase, rehab and future upkeep of this trailer and has put out a call to all clubs to donate to this fund.

One of the first clubs to donate was the Heath Lions Club who challenged all other OH7 clubs to match or exceed their donation of \$100. We are excited to report that several clubs have accepted the challenge!

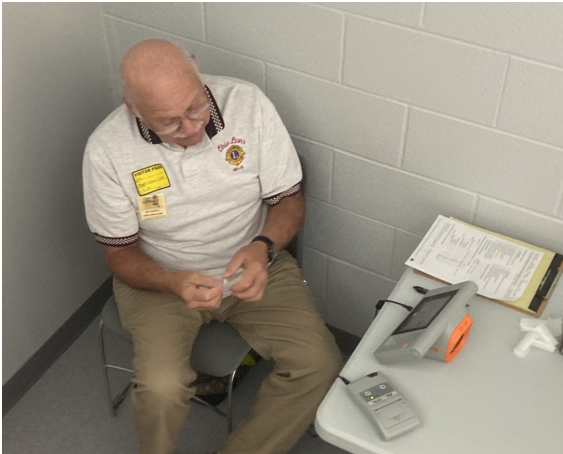
