





The student, a young lady, is legally blind with tunnel vision and will need considerable help to achieve her goal of becoming a journalist. The unique capabilities of the iPad will be of great assistance to her in life and at college in the fall. This is the same young lady to whom we gave scholarship funds.

An Apple iPad has voice recognition and voice feedback to interface with all the Applications. It can be used to dictate documents, read emails, read books, navigate via GPS and lots more. Its technology has become a lifeline to visually handicapped persons.

Lion Jerry Lindstrom of the East Knox Lions headed the effort to get donations totaling \$1200 from the club, friends of the club, funds facilitated by the Knox Community Foundation and the First Congregational Church.


She was taken to the Apple store where she got the iPad and keyboard/cover. Apple employees set it up totally as hers and downloaded special Apps that she will need to make it work for her. She was really excited and learned very fast.

This is the second device the East Knox Lions Club has worked to gather funds for recently. In March 2013, they headed the efforts to provide a computer assisted "Optical Reader" for a kindergartner. It allowed her to read the blackboard and written material. Its need was totally different than the iPad.




Greetings Fellow Lions,


