Dear Lions Youth Supporters,

Thank you for all the things you do! "You are fantastic" because the real service takes place by ordinary Lions doing extraordinary work. Lions local accomplishments and global influence comes from 'networking' together. It's going outside our communities to bring back ideas, concepts, and funds that are beyond our local capacity that makes Lionism what it is today. Lions Quest is one of these programs that can provide life skills to our local youth but is too costly to be provided by a local club.

This is a request for One (1) Dollar from each Lion in Ohio. It's the small things that make a big difference. If each Lion in Ohio would donate \$1.00, it would generate more than the cost of training 40 teachers. This dollar-per-Lion can be collected by the club treasurer and forwarded to: Ohio Lions, Inc. Attention: MD 13 Treasurer PCC Jay Gray, 4074 Hoover Road, Grove City, Ohio 43123. Please note it's for Lions Quest on the memo line.

The Multi-District 13 Lions Quest Committee met 16-October and will apply for a \$25,000 LCI Core -4 Grant. It is a 75-25% matching grant. We need to provide 25% which is \$8,333 and LCI will provide 75% or \$25,000. The funds will be used for teacher workshops on a first come first served basis and will train/certify teachers to use and acquire additional Lions Quest Materials. The cost of a single workshop for 40 teachers is \$9,500 which will provide each participant with the new teaching packet. Additionally, not required, is to provide lunches and snacks during the workshop. These workshops require active participation and generally work during the lunch with interaction and conversation. Any Lion can attend and participant without charge.
