

Why Am | a Lion?



I recently had several 'experiences' which helped remind me why I am a Lion. In April of this year my wife and I traveled to Florence, Italy. One day during our stay we visited the Piazza de la Republica where the Lions of Florence were celebrating Lions Day. This

celebration focused on accessibility for people in wheelchairs and acceptability of people in wheelchairs by showing just how mobile and versatile people in wheelchairs can be. They had demonstrations of people in wheelchairs playing basketball and even ballroom dancing. It was exhilarating to see the large crowd cheer and applaud the skills displayed by these courageous people. It was uplifting to know that everyone has dreams and aspirations and that they can achieve those dreams with a little help; help from people like Lions. I was proud to meet a few of the Florence Lions and although we couldn't speak each other's language we both understood the bond of service we share when I was able to communicate that "I'm a Lion, too!". Yes, we share a bond of service by serving our communities all around the world.

My other "experience" was to have retinal surgery on both eyes shortly after we returned from Italy. This left me functionally blind for a short time. I thank

God that my vision is returning because of the skills of my ophthalmologist and the excellent care I received. As my eyes were healing I comprehended that not everyone in the world has access to this level of eye care, not everyone has access to eyeglasses to help correct vision problems, not everyone has access to the medicines and simple tests that could detect problems and prevent blindness. I also understood the loneliness and isolation that blindness can bring; I couldn't watch TV, read a newspaper or go anywhere on my own. Somewhere in the midst of this I thought about Helen Keller's struggles to overcome her handicap. I marveled at her perseverance and her wisdom to understand that in 1925 not many blind people had the dedicated assistance that she had. That's why she asked Lions to be the "Knights of the Blind", to help fill the void so blind people could be accepted and fully functional people in our society. I'm pleased that Melvin Jones had the vision to accept Helen's challenge; it defined our organization and changed the world. So, why do we collect eyeglasses, why do we do eye screenings, why do we support the Lions Eye bank, why do we support Pilot Dogs, why do we sponsor the radio reading service? We do all this and more because we are Lions, we help one another and "We Serve".



- 2 Log in your user name (i.e. membership number) and password
- 3 In the box of My Tasks click on Service Activities, including Centennial Services
- 4 Click on date, and enter date of activity
- 5 "Select Type" to add a service activity
- 6 Add activity description, number served, etc.
- 7 You must click on add activity for each item entered
- 8 Centennial Community Legacy projects are located under the Community Cultural Activity category
- 9 For entering a Legacy project, report the activity description and the level, either 1, 2, or 3
 - 1 Bike rack, park benches, new Lions signs at the entrance of your community
 - 2 Establishing a community garden, refurbishing a garden, provide medical equipment
 - 3 Build a clinic, school, hospital or library
