That project is still ongoing and further donations to it are needed. The new kennel building is almost under roof and interior work is about to begin. 






CENTERBURG LIONS

LION BOB CROCK & FAMILY NEED YOUR PRAYERS



Lion Bob Crock and his wife Desni went through tough times beginning about 8 years ago. Their then 2 year old daughter, Bridget, was diagnosed with cancer. Bridget is now a 10 year old survivor. Her little sister, Anna, who is 7 years old, has just been diagnosed with cancer as well. Kids get cancer too. Below is a message from Desni Crock (Aug 30, 2016): My eldest daughter had cancer caused by a gene mutation called Dicer 1 and that Anna also has this mutation. We are currently sitting at Nationwide with Anna and just learned that she too has cancer. There is a mass behind her eye. It is large and quick growing. We have not met with the oncologist yet and do not know the protocol, but will likely include chemo Awareness month and the removal of the eye. I'm trying to avoid the pity party and Anna and I have been talking about how she will get to

wear the purple shirt at Relay for Life like her sister and be a BrAva Survivor like her too. (BrAva's a local organization developed in honor of Bridget and another local little girl, Ava, who unfortunately did not win her battle against cancer). She is pretty psyched for that, but cries at having her eye cut out and having to wear glasses because in her mind they are equally bad. Many have said how unfair it is for us to "go through this again". For me, the battle never ended. This is not a new war, it just became intense again. I am a veteran to this war and am armed with knowledge, experience, and a ton of love and support. As I keep telling Anna, Daddy and I got Bridget through it, we'll get her through it too. While I would do nearly anything to bring awareness to the need for more childhood cancer research, this was not part of my plan for September. But when given lemons...so, many of you have asked how you can help. Here is how. You absolutely have my permission to share our story, Anna's picture and anything I post to promote childhood cancer awareness and research. This is unfair! It's unfair to all of us with kids with cancer. Don't pity us, I can't handle that. Help us fight this shit! Enough is enough. Keep prayers going! I can handle that and feel it.

PLEASE keep this family in you thoughts and prayers. They are strong, but they can sure use the awesome power of prayer once again!





We all fished for about 7 hours and caught 70–80 fish. Not all were keepers but 24 of the walleyes made it over the 15 inch limit with several in the 19 - 20inch size. The others were catch and release and included small walleyes, white perch, yellow perch, sheepshead and catfish. The keepers weighed in at 31 pounds and were divided evenly between the fishermen.
