I did not write that statement but the message is as important today as it has been. We all have our talents, some hidden, some not and it is up to us to bring out those talents so we all contribute to the end product



# **District 35-I Kidsight News**

These are exciting times for our Kidsight screening program. Our District 35-I Sight Foundation was awarded a \$49,500 Standard matching grant from Lions Club International Foundation in June and we have received the matching grant funds.

Thanks go to all the different clubs and organizations which donated funds to the Sight Foundation to help match the LCIF grant.

The Sight Foundation has completed purchasing vision screening instruments (Plusoptix S09 screeners and Pediavision Spot screeners) to be placed in 6 different locations throughout the district.

The goal of the KidSight screening program is to identify preschool age children who have problems which can cause poor vision in one or both eyes (amblyopia).

These problems may be juvenile cataracts (rare), misaligned eyes (Strabismus), and abnormal refractive errors (need for glasses) including farsightedness, nearsightedness and astigmatism.

The vision screeners can detect all of the above problems objectively, just by taking an image of the child's eyes. The children do not need to tell the examiners what they see.

We would like to make sure that no child grows up with a lazy eye (amblyopia) in District 35-I. If we catch the problem early in the child's life it is much easier to treat completely and restore normal vision. After age 9 lazy eye cannot be treated successfully and continues throughout the person's life. Early detection in 3-5 year olds leads to easier and better treatment.

The mission is large. There are about 57,000 children born each year in District 35-I. Amblyopia occurs in about 4% of all children so this means that if we screen all the children at risk we can save the vision of 2,280 children each year! Below is a breakdown of the numbers of children born yearly in each county in our district.

We are "Knights of the Blind" and saving vision is our main mission as Lions. The Kidsight program is easy to start and run.

We encourage clubs to get started in this important program. Here is how you can get started.






