Hello Fellow Lions

August proved to be a busy month with the first Multiple District 35-L Conference in The Villages and my first chance to really meet all of the dedicated Lions that will be serving as your Governors and Vice-Governors and their partners in service this year. It proved to be both an educational and social event and I look forward to working with them all.

The weekend provided an opportunity to learn more and get an in depth picture of the FL Lions Conklin Center and the FL Lions Foundation. Both of these organizations will be glad to send representatives to your clubs and/or zone meetings to present an in depth program on their facilities and services.

The FL Lions Conklin Center in Daytona Beach is a human services agency for multihandicapped and visually impaired adults and children that opened in 1979. The adult students are taught skills and offered support to work in real jobs and to live on their own within their communities. After graduation there is long-term, low intensity services to provide the assistance many graduates need to live on their own.

The FL Lions Foundation in Wauchula was formed in 1958 to assist Lions clubs in Florida and the Bahamas by helping to provide individual sight care/surgeries to needy persons within their individual communities and has remained their primary objective. Funds to support this eye care program are received by club donations, interest from trust funds and bequests.

Both of these entities are in need of financial support from the Lions of MD 35. Through the years our Lions and clubs have stepped up to help but recently there has been a great decline in this support. Sadly, there have been entities over the past years that have suffered and have gone the way of extinction, like the Dodo bird. I ask you wholeheartedly to talk to your clubs and when the time comes to budget and dispense some of your hard earned fund raising monies you please remember these two fine services that are provided here in our state. And, to remember those in need who have been helped over the years with their vision problems, surgeries, support and training in everyday living and work skills, etc. Only in this way can we ensure that both of these will continue to grow and to reach out with their humanitarian services within our communities.

To DG Pat Hall I wish to say: "Great Job" on your first District 35-L Cabinet Meeting in Jacksonville and a "Thank You" to the members of the Jacksonville/Arlington Lions Club for again hosting a most memorable evening. As you are reading this the Marianna Lions Club will have celebrated their 75th Charter Anniversary in August. Kudos and Thank You for the dedication and service your club has shown over the years. The future months will see me and my Partner in Service, Lion Diane, visiting clubs within the Multiple District, at the USA/Canada Forum, at Zone Meetings, and of course at the District Cabinet Meetings and Multiple District 35-L Conferences. This is always a wonderful experience for us and we hope to see many of you along the way. Remember: "Service... is the rent we pay for living on this planet."

KidSight Project By: IPDG Jerry Skufe, District Coordinator

Much progress was made during August to move toward District-wide implementation of the KidSight Project. First, we received \$22,500 from LCIF for the purchase of Plusoptix equipment to conduct vision screenings. Secondly, the District Cabinet decided on the placement of the eight (8) Plusoptix units being purchased. They will be assigned to seven (7) clubs and one (1) Lions clinic as follows: Baker, Jacksonville Beach Noon, Lake Butler, North Santa Rosa, Ocala, Palatka New Vision, Pensacola Lions Eye Clinic, and Tallahassee. Thirdly, the purchase order, along with a check, was sent to Plusoptix for the purchase of eight (8) units. Last, but not least, the partnership with the University of Florida was firmed up.

The Plusoptix equipment will be shipped within the next week or so. While that's going on, we'll be scheduling training and after that, clubs will be able to contact day care centers and schools to set up screenings. The training will be led by Melissa Soloff of the UF KidSight office. She advised me that because of her schedule the training will have to take place on a Saturday or a Sunday. It will take a few months to fully implement throughout the District, however, we're off and running. We still need to complete the development and issuance of an operating guideline, as well as publishing information on the Lions to contact where the equipment is located so clubs wishing to get involved can do so.

For Lions attending the USA/Canada Lions Forum in Tampa during September 13-15, 2012, be aware that Dr. Howard Freedman, MD-35 KidSight Project Chair, will be holding a meeting to discuss some of the operational issues associated with the statewide implementation of the KidSight Program. District 35-L Lions attending the Forum who are involved in their club's KidSight activities are encouraged to attend. The time and place of the meeting will be posted at the conference site.

Melissa will forward all referrals to Amy Perry for review and appropriate action. Currently, Dr. Nausheen Khuddus is looking for an office to house the KidSight program. Once found, we will share the address with clubs. August 13, 2012
