
#### **District Governor's Message**



Diana M. Castillo of Miami, a member of Miami Five StarsLions Club, attended an event at the White House, on Tuesday, October 2, in Washington, D.C. that recognized Lions club members as Champions of Change because of their nearly 100 years of volunteer service in communities around the world.

"Visiting the White House was very exciting," said Castillo "and this experience was a great opportunity for us, as Lions club members, to gather with government officials to share information and ideas and to honor the men and women who are serving their communities in every state and around the globe."

This day-long event, co-hosted by the White House and Lions Clubs

International, included an in-depth briefing session on issues pertaining to community service between Lions and key government agency officials from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, U.S. Department of Education and others. The day also included panel discussions with the 11 men and women Lions who were selected to represent the 1.35 million Lions members worldwide as Champions of Change.

Those who were unable to attend the recognition were encouraged to watch the proceedings as they were streamed live on the Internet. The recorded session can be viewed on the Lions Clubs International YouTube channel at www.youtube.com/lionsclubsorg. Viewers are encouraged to Tweet

about the event using the hashtag #WHLIONS.
Since the Miami Five Stars Lions Club's chartering in 2011, its members have worked on a variety of projects in the local community, such as helping the elderly, back to school program, diabetes and vision screening. Proceeds from past fundraising events have gone to vision programs and children school programs. The club is currently working with the American Diabetes Association in Feria por tu familia to be held in the

month of November.

# "Dining in the Dark"

Volunteers from the Palm Beach County North Lions Club (PBCN) once again assisted with the Sixth Annual Thomas Hartig Dining in the Dark Dinner held at the Hilton Palm Beach Airport Hotel, Saturday evening, October 13. The event raised \$20,000 for the Florida Outreach Center for the Blind (FOCB). PBCN Lions Bill Lapp, Noreen and Jerry Fleagle and Frank Seidman, assisted in all phases of the event. The Executive Director of FOCB is Lion Carolyn Lapp.

Guests ate their dinners in total darkness to the wonderful music of Jason Colannino, himself visually impaired by retinitis pegmentosa.

Nearly 200 guests were treated to the uplifting message of keynote speaker, David Bigoney. Blinded by a bullet wound sixteen years ago at the age of 23, the husband and father thrilled his audience with the story of his ordeal, recovery and accomplishments. David, a lifelong athlete, founded the Team Vision Foundation, whose mission is to connect individuals with visual challenges to sports and healthy living. David is the first totally blind person to compete in the Iron Man triathlon, composed of swimming, biking and running. He thrilled us all when he participated in the Motivation Man marathon

last June in West Palm Beach. Volunteers from the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office SWAT team seated the guests and served their entrees using night vision goggles.

For three hours, guests had the opportunity to step into the shoes of the blind and visually impaired. Without vision, information from our other senses becomes more noticeable and conversation becomes more intimate. For those that are blind, this was a chance for friends and family to experience, even for a few short hours, what those who are blind live with every day. And for those who fear losing their sight, it's an opportunity to find out that the world does not end when the lights go out.

Major sponsors included the Palm Beach Kennel Club, Delray Motors, McGladrey Consultants and the PBCN Lions Club.

The Center offers full-service training to blind and visually impaired individuals. It provides instructions in Braille, computers, daily living skills, cooking and personal and home management. Additional information on FOCB is available on the web at http://www.flblindcenter.org.



## Lions Commemorative "Century of Service" Coin Bill Signed!

President Barack Obama signed the "Lions Clubs International Century of Service Commemorative Coin Act" into law on Oct. 5, 2012, providing a worthy tribute to the millions of Lions who have served their communities during the last 100 years. With the tireless work of Lions across the U.S., the bill gained strong bi-partisan support.

The \$1 coin will be available in 2017 to celebrate Lions Clubs International's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. In addition to highlighting a century of charitable services to people in need, a surcharge of \$10 for every commemorative coin sold - without any cost to taxpayers - will be donated to LCIF.

"This coin will provide greater awareness of our organization, encourage Lions to move forward with their selfless volunteer service, and raise critical resources to continue to help those in need," said Lions Clubs International President Wayne A. Madden.

"On behalf of Lions clubs and our communities, I would like to express our deep appreci-

ation to the sponsors of the Commemorative Coin Bill, U.S. Senator Jerry Moran of Kansas, U.S. Representative Peter Roskam of Illinois, and U.S. Representative Larry Kissell of North Carolina. It is thanks to their determined efforts along with the support of all of our House and Senate co-sponsors that this bill was signed into law. Lions should be proud of our advocacy and outreach success in getting such broad support for the Coin Bill."

The U.S. Mint creates only two commemorative coins per year by acts of Congress. The commemorative coin program calls for the minting and issuance of up to 400,000 silver dollars. Both proof and uncirculated versions of the coins would be produced. The coins may only be issued during the calendar year beginning January 1, 2017

# **Did You Ever Wonder Why...**

dimes, quarters and half dollars have notches (milling), while pennies and nickels do not?

A: The US Mint began putting notches on the edges of coins containing gold and silver to discourage holders from shaving off small quantities of the precious metals. Dimes, quarters and half dollars are notched because they used to contain silver. Pennies and nickels aren't notched because the metals they contain are not valuable enough to shave.

# Fundraising Event For FL Lions Conklin Center

The Mount Dora Lions Club (District 35-0) is promoting a state-wide "loose change" activity that will financially benefit the Florida Lions Conklin Center. The Mount Dora Lions challenges every Lion in the state to be part of this fundraising event, setting a \$25 goal for every Florida Lion! Mount Dora Lion Mary Pezzo, 1st Vice President of the Conklin Center, is co-coordinating the project. Hopefully, collecting your "loose change" will help reach the Florida Lions portion budget - \$150,000, which averages out to \$25 per Florida Lion! We can do it!

Management: Each Club can request ten cardboard coin-collecting containers from Mary Pezzo. Lion Mary Pezzo will prepare a report of the average amount for each Club (using the LCI Membership Club roster from December 2012). Following the 4<sup>th</sup> Cabinet Meeting in each District, a report will be distributed to the Florida Lions Conklin Center, the District Governors and each District newsletter.

Incentive: Each Club that meets the \$25 per member goal by the last Cabinet Meeting in their District (Lion Year 2012 -13) will be formally recognized by the Conklin Center. The deadline for the Recognition Program from the Conklin Center will be the date of each District's 4th Cabinet Meeting.


