To file your Annual Report, simply go to the Division of Corporations' website, <u>www.sunbiz.org</u> and file online. All Florida Corporations (Lions Foundations) must file an Annual Report to maintain "active" status and avoid administrative dissolution or revocation. Instructions are available on the website, and you may pay by credit card, check, or through a sunbiz account. Do not be misled by similar websites. Go to <u>www.sunbiz.org</u> and you will see a banner at the top of the screen stating 'Florida Department of State, Division of Corporations.' File now; it is easy, quick and secure.
