
includes membership, literacy, poverty and youth.


long run your club will reap benefits from this.

Here we are at the beginning of an exciting new Lionistic year. I hope everyone will open the International Lions Magazine and our own Multiple-District Magazine and read about our 2013-2014 International

President Barry Palmer. He is an exciting, dynamic Lion who has a huge passion for Lionism and asks a lot of himself and of all Lions. He will be very visible on social media. Those who met him when he visited Multiple District 35 know he is welcoming, friendly, energetic, and full of ideas.

Our District Governor Al Becker spoke of President Palmer's theme of "Follow Your Dream" and the goals he has set for Lions during the coming year. For the first few months we will focus on membership. Below is one idea for signing up new members but, it is only one idea. Lions who have tried successful new ideas, please, let me know, so I can share.

Yes, our district has many wonderful, hard-working Lions. Because of attrition we must constantly grow. For varied reasons there are many Lions who are great members and continue to support their club, but their participation in projects may be limited. By adding members who can work and bring new skills to clubs, there are more hands to serve.



Who do we ask to join and how do we do it? There are many approaches. Each needs to be comfortable to the person or club using it. For a long time, cold calls have been the method mostly used. Many Lions feel it was only moderate successful. An updated version is to make warm calls on area officials, business leaders, education leaders, law enforcement, etc. Begin by identifying those to approach. Prepare a letter explaining who Lions are, how a club benefits the community, how it provides an opportunity to volunteer, and while not the main objective, an opportunity for networking. Computers make it easy to personalize the letter for each recipient. Include a date that the prospective member will be called to arrange a meeting to discuss upcoming projects to visit. Seeing what Lions do provides a strong incentive for someone to visit a club meeting and, perhaps, to go ahead and join.

What is presented here is only a thumbnail sketch of this method. I encourage every membership chair to contact your district GMT for more in depth information and take what is learned back to their club.

Get your club involved by reporting the activities of your members in the District 35-O Active Club Award Contest. To be entered in the contest, clubs must submit a District 35-O "Active Club Award Report" form. Monthly reports must be postmarked no later than the fifth day following the month of the report and sent to Lion Joe Hauser, 603 Jillotus Street, Merritt Island, FL 32952 or email as noted above. Contest runs from April 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014. Reports for April, May, June and July of 2013 must be submitted no later than September 5th to be counted towards this year's award. Awards will be presented at the annual District Luncheon held during the Multiple District Convention in May. The complete rules and form are available on the website. For help with one of the biggest problems in Lionism, RETENTION, consider participating in the District 35-O Active Club Contest.

ARE YOUR LIONS CLUB AND FOUNDATION PROTECTED?

Although most clubs feel their assets are secure, member theft can and does occur. Dishonesty Bonds, also called Crime/Fidelity Bonds, are a form of insurance protection that covers the policyholders for losses that they incur as a result of fraudulent acts by specified individuals. They usually insure an entity (Club/Foundation) for losses caused by the dishonest acts (such as theft) of its members. These insurance policies protect from losses of Club/Foundation monies, securities, and other property. Policies are available through insurance agencies and are typically written for 1 or 3 years with discounted rates for a multi-year policy. If you have both a club and a foundation, make sure both are named on the policy or take out a separate policy for each. Also your Board of Directors should decide on the amount of the coverage needed to protect the assets of your organization(s). Rates may typically run about \$250 for a 3 year policy with \$10,000 coverage. Ask your insurance agent to provide you with a quote.

Also, LCI has arranged for a program of <u>supplemental insurance coverage</u> in which Lions Clubs, Districts and other authorized Lions organizations in the United States may apply to purchase certain coverage at discounted rates. Coverage is underwritten by Philadelphia Insurance and QBE Insurance.

THE SCOOP ON CLUB DUES - DISTRICT BILLS HAVE BEEN SENT OUT

Lions Clubs International bills each club directly in January and July for the number of members as of December 31 and June 30. When you add new members, LCI bills your club as they are added, prorated by time left in the current billing period. The amount of the clubs dues depends on the number of regular, family, life and student members in your club. These dues are paid directly to LCI. Multiple District 35 (MD35) bills each of the four Districts in January and July for the number of members as of December 31 and June 30. The rate is \$10.50 for six months for all members except for student members; that rate is \$5.25. MD35 does not bill the clubs immediately for new members. They are prorated and added at the next billing. Then each district bills each of their clubs accordingly. District 35-O bills each club using the same method as MD35 except that there is no discount for students. Our District dues are \$4 for six months. The district bills each club for this amount plus the dues owed to MD35. Checks are to be payable to Florida Lions District 35-O for the total amount billed. Example: A club had 30 members on June 30, 2013 and added 2 members in April, 2013; no students.

MD-35 DUES: $30 \times 10.50 = 315.00$

MD Prorated for new members in April: $2 \times \$5.25 = \10.50

DISTRICT 35-O DUES: 30 x \$4 = \$120.00

District Prorated for new members in April: 2 x \$2 = \$ 4.00 TOTAL CLUB DUES PAYABLE TO DISTRICT 35-0 = \$449.50


