ANNOUNCEMENTS & NOTABLE ITEMS

CHANGES IN LCI FAMILY MEMBERSHIP FEES – EFFECTIVE JULY 1st

Beginning July 1, 2013, all NEW family members will pay the one-time entrance fee or charter fee. Up to four additional qualifying family members will still pay only half international dues. This change will not impact existing family-member Lions.

NOTE: Until July 1, 2013 only the "Head of Household" is charged the \$25 new Member Fee (\$30 for Charter Members). Up to four additional family members, living at the same address, can join the same club without paying this fee. If you have a family member who is considering joining, NOW would be the time to do so in order for the club to vote in the new member and to get the new member entered into the MyLCI system before the end of this month!

INCREASES IN LCI MEMBERSHIP DUES– EFFECTIVE JULY 1st

Effective July 1st 2013, the six month billing of membership dues with LCI will increase \$1.00 for each regular member and \$0.50 for each family and student member.

FLORIDA LICENSE PLATE BENEFITING THE BLIND & VISUALLY IMPAIRED

Benefiting blind and visually impaired Floridians through the services of local nonprofit agencies statewide, the "A State of Vision" specialty license plates rolled off the presses on January 26th, 2007. Robert Kelly, Executive Director of the Conklin Center says: "Thousands of Floridians with limited vision or blindness will have a brighter future because of the 'A State of Vision' license tag."

How do I get this license tag? Take your current tag to your local tag agency and purchase the new tag.

- Do I have to wait until my tag's annual renewal? No. In fact, you will get a credit for all unused time on your current tag.
- How much does it cost? The normal license plate fees apply, plus \$25 which benefits blind & visually impaired Floridians.

Who gets the \$25 and how does it



benefit the blind? The Florida Association of Agencies Serving the Blind (FAASB), a statewide nonprofit organization, receives the \$25. It is distributed among 14 member agencies to be used for hands-on "direct support services" to blind and visually impaired Floridians throughout the state. The Conklin Center has been a member of FAASB since 1979.

How long will the plates be available? The plates are available when at least 1,000 are sold each year.

WHY AUDITS ARE SO IMPORTANT!!!

Lakeland Woman Sentenced to Prison in Theft from Lions Club

THE LEDGER, Published: Monday, May 20, 2013 at 10:04 p.m.

- A Lakeland woman has been sentenced to five years in prison followed by 25 years of probation for stealing more than \$50,000 from the Imperial Lakeland Lions Club. Caroline Bonds, 49, who served as the club's treasurer, was arrested in December. During a Friday hearing, she pleaded guilty to grand theft and three counts of money laundering. An arrest affidavit states the club received an inheritance worth more than \$50,000 in 2006. Over the years, Bonds transferred money to her personal bank account as well as made cash withdrawals, the affidavit states. Bonds' theft was devastating to the nonprofit organization, and the club disbanded.
- The judge ordered Bonds to "make every honest effort" during her probation to pay \$50,378 in restitution, which will be given to the Dixieland Lions Club. If Bonds violates terms of her probation, she could face up to 25 years in prison.

You will also be required to provide a unique e-mail address. Note: Lions officers who previously created a user name and password for MyLCI will be able to use the same user name and password for MyLCI during their 2013-2014 term. If you forgot your password, click the "Forgot your User Name or Password?" link on the log on page. You will be prompted to enter your member number, the word verification and the answer to one of your security questions. Keep in mind, your responses to your security questions are case sensitive.
