PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



December is a very busy month as well as a fun time of the year. Parties to attend, Christmas greetings to send, children home from school, family traditions to celebrate and gifts wrapped in pretty paper for our families and loved ones. As I think of the giving of gifts the most precious gifts do not always come in boxes wrapped in pretty paper.

Looking back at history we have benefits from many gifts that were not and could not be placed under the tree. During the formative years of our country we were beneficiaries of a group of colonial soldiers crossing the Delaware River on Christmas Eve led by General George Washington to change the course of the Revolutionary War against an oppressive English King. During Christmas of December 1944 a small group of American soldiers at the Belgian City of Bastogne were surrounded and outnumbered by Nazi Army groups. The American soldiers although short of food and ammunition and out of medical supplies refused to surrender the City which was key to blocking the German advance. The selfless courage and actions of these men were a gift to all freedom loving people. The courage and resolve of these soldiers stopped the German offensive in what became known as "The Battle of the Bulge", led to the failure of Germany's last major effort to defeat Democracy in World War II. These selfless gifts have become part of our heritage.

Each member of the Florida Lions Foundation for the Blind provides selfless gifts all year long that do not come wrapped in a box. We give the "Gift of Sight". At our January meeting we will be approving 50+ new eye surgery cases. This is in addition to the 175 cases approved year to date. That is 225 cases which is well on the way to setting a new annual record of eye cases. I cannot think of a better way to celebrate this gift giving season than to know that we are providing people that many of us never know with the ability to see. The recipients of these surgeries do not have the financial resources necessary to obtain the costly surgeries that they receive as a direct result of the work of the Foundation. I congratulate and thank each and every member of our foundation who provide the hard work and generosity that makes this "Gift of Sight' possible.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY/TREASURER'S MESSAGE

HAPPY YEAR YEAR TO ALL



At this time I am preparing the financial report for our meeting on January 5^{th} . This year our President at his installation talked about the importance of the district's goals to be able to continue our motto "WE SERVE".

In years past we had several district competitions to meet the goals and also to obtain 100% club participation. This hasn't happened in several years and as our President stressed the Foundation needs to get back to this. We certainly don't want to get into a

position that we will have to reduce what we are able to provide.

The past two years since we redistricted, each district's goals has been set at \$55,000.00. We have come close but haven't yet reached 100% of the goals. We have 274 clubs, with 35-L at 84, 35-I at 54, 35-O at 63 and 35-N at 73. This month completes 8 months of our 2012-2013 year. To reach goal in each district we need \$ 4,584 per month. At the 8-month mark we should have received \$ 36,672.00. When you get the completed reports you will see that we are now at 43.93% of the goal or short by \$ 50,036.90.

This year we have indicated that we need everyone on the board to be an active Drive Director and as you look over these reports you can see what the clubs are donating and where your help is most needed.

We all know that many clubs haven't scheduled all their fundraising until the end of the year. Just as a reminder, the Foundation's year is May through April. This year with our annual meeting being scheduled for May 3rd the cutoff date for donations will be April 20th to count for this current year. Funds donated as of that date will become our budget for next year. Thank you for all the support that has been given thus far and all that will come during the next 4 months. Your efforts truly are appreciated by the board of directors and by our hundreds of clients in Florida and The Bahamas.
