FLORIDA LIONS FOUNDATION FOR THE BLIND Website

Our Foundation continues to provide more and more eye care surgeries for needy individuals in our communities. At our directors meeting on March 9th, 32 new cases were approved at an estimated cost of \$156,946. Club co-pays of \$6,300. Negotiated savings are \$102,002. Cost to Foundation is \$48,644. Ten of those 32 new cases were from District 35-O, with an estimated cost of \$42,964; club co-pays of

\$2,000; negotiated savings of \$28,598, and a cost to the foundation of \$12,366.

The Foundation's fiscal year began May 1, 2013 and our year-to-date totals are: Total cases: 222; Estimated cost: \$1,111,090; Club Co-pays: \$44,100; Savings: \$740,704; Cost to Foundation: \$326,286.

Each of the four MD-35 Districts has a funding raising goal of \$55,000 for a yearly total of \$220,000. As of the end of February, clubs in our multiple district have only donated \$122,540, or 56% of the goal. Prior to the March district meeting, District 35-O clubs have donated \$29,200, or 53% of goal, while the Foundation has provided assistance to the district of \$75,218. Granted we will receive more funds at this district meeting, but we will not meet our goal.

An additional \$97,460 will be needed from the four districts by April 20, 2014 to meet the goal of \$220,000. Our district's share of that is \$25,800. The Foundation's budget for next year cannot exceed the monies donated during this fiscal year for serving all those needing our assistance in 2014-2015.

LIONS OF DISTRICT 35-O HEARING PROGRAM

How our program works: Our meetings are held on the third Wednesday each month. We require that a club submit an application (which we provide) and a \$25 check. The check is given to the hearing specialist or audiologist testing the client and making the mold. The hearing board reviews the application and makes a decision. If applicant is not accepted, the \$25 check is returned. The decisions are based on the applicants income verses expenses. It is important to ask about insurance. Medicaid, Veteran's Administration and some rehab programs provide new hearing aids.

Adults 18 and over receive refurbished aids. We do make some exceptions if they can not be fitted with refurbished aids and new aids are then approved. Children 17 and younger are fitted with new aids. Applications for children must be accompanied by a letter from a school nurse, doctor or hearing specialist. The hearing board pays for all additional expenses.

Also, we have a "Honorary Life Membership" program. \$100 gives a Lion or friend a certificate and pin into the program. This money is not set aside. It is used to purchase more hearing aids.
