A FOUNDATION FOR YOUR LIONS CLUB

The Council of Governors has approved the free distribution of instructions and associated documents that will assist Lions Clubs in creating their own club-level, tax-exempt Foundation using the new IRS 1023-EZ short application form. This package is only for establishing new club-level 501c3 Foundations that have less than \$50,000 annual income and total assets under \$250,000. It can be used to reinstate those Foundations who have lost their tax-exempt status, but it is not for Clubs that have lost their 501c4 tax status.

Requests for the instruction manual should be made by e-mail; distribution will be made via electronic transfer in .pdf format and subject to the following provisions:

- 1. The instruction manual and related documents are not to be considered legal advise; the user takes full responsibility for the security of the material.
- 2.The instruction manual can be used solely by the Lions Club requesting the material and it shall not be distributed to any person or organization.
- 3.The material is being distributed free of cost. If the Lions Club decides to use the material to apply for their tax-exempt status, a suggested donation of \$100.00 will be made to the Florida Lions Foundation for the Blind; this can be applied to a Life Membership.
- 4.Following the delivery of the material, the Lions Club has 60 days to decide to use the material; after that, it shall be destroyed. This is a security issue, you can re-order.





A Special Contribution To the District 35-O Newsletter

When I was born, I was fully developed with perfect sight and good health. I lived a normal childhood. I played soccer from preschool through high school. I was also an Editor in Chief of the yearbook for three year and graduated high school with honors.

After high school, I attend the local community college and I had multiple positions at Macaroni Grill. I was always able to drive and liked being able to make my own money.

On July 22, 2007 my life changed. I was in a car accident with a semi-truck on the interstate. My car slammed into the truck and was totaled. I don't remember any of it because I was so severely injured, I spent a month in the Neuro ICU in a drug induced coma. My injuries included breaking every bone in my face, my jaw was broken in three places and I had a traumatic brain injury. I lost all vision in my left eye, but I have very limited in my right. I have no feeling on the whole right side of my face, I can't smell because they removed my sinus' and I'm deaf in my right ear. Due to the surgeries to my mouth I have to drink form a straw all the time. I was in the hospital for 3 months and had to do physical and occupational therapy in rehab. When I was released from the hospital, I continued to live in Wesley Chapel, FL. I was very depressed and had to start taking medication. After about 5 months, I started (Continued Next Column)

to be able to move around better and do more things for myself. I knew that I was here for a reason and that I had a purpose. So, in 2009 I decided that I wanted to move to Orlando and rent a house with a few of my friends. I was able to cook, clean, pay my own bills. I really just wanted to be able to work and do the things I used to do. I tried going to The Lighthouse for the Blind and Visually Impaired, but they had limited services for me in Orlando.

I moved back home again and The Division of Blind Services contacted me and recommended that I go to the Conklin Center. My main goal was to get my life back. I learned a lot of things that enabled me to feel independent and like an active part of society. I now have a job working part-time at Dunkin Donuts and am independently living in an apartment (Conklin's). I am on my way to having my own apartment and will graduate by May!
