It's Not Finished Until The Paperwork is Done!



In the December
Newsletter I provided
info on reporting
across the District.
We're now in the last
month of this Lions
year and it's time to

report the improvement made! Here are your new numbers.

In December 23 clubs had not reported service activities this year --- NOW only 16 clubs have not reported. In December 35 clubs had reported service activity with a total of 20,400 hours and 26,940 people served - NOW 43 clubs have reported activities with a total of 83,794 hours and 86,552 people served!

In December 10 clubs had not reported membership in the past 60 days --NOW only 6 clubs have not recently reported! In December 47 clubs had reported membership in the past 60 days --NOW 58 clubs have recently reported!

In December we had lost 83 members and added 114 for a net gain of 31 members - NOW we have lost 215 members and added 261 for a net gain of 46 members! (As of today we have 1,478 members in District 350)

Every number, with the exception of dropped members, is headed in the right direction! Please remember to report activity and membership on time in June so we can close out the year with accurate numbers. (Remember, the next billing is based on June membership reporting). Congratulations and Thank You to all clubs for improved activity and membership reporting!

There are two awards for the 2014-2015 Lions year that need your attention. The 100% Secretary Award form must be postmarked or emailed to the Cabinet Secretary no later than July 15, 2015. The Club Excellence Award for 2014-2015 must



These District leaders have ideas and "out of the box" ways to help that you may not have considered. Trust them to be helpful and discreet. Give them a chance to find a way for you to remain a Lion. If you don't seize the opportunity, how do you know what will happen? Perhaps you aren't the only one thinking the same way but others lack the courage to speak up. Sometimes you have to take a chance! Take a minute to remember why you wanted to be a Lion. Please don't be the member slipping out the back door!
