PROJECT RIGHT-TO-SIGHT Lion Mary Pezzo



Greetings,

I am happy to report that the Lions Community Eye Clinic (LCEC), operating out of the Orange Blossom Family Health Center in Orlando, sponsored by 35 O Project Right To Sight, Inc

completed 280 eye exams in 2015.

In most cases, we are able give our clients a complete eye exam and dispense glasses on the same day before we send them on their way. Currently, we have about 10 Clubs that use the LCEC – cost the Club \$25 for each client. The glasses they receive are from the glasses collected by Lions Clubs in District 35!

Also, in 2015, PRTS provided approximately 145,000 readers collected by Lions Clubs in District 35 to those that could not afford the readers but had the need. 6,000 of those readers were given to Florida residents and the rest were sent along with Mission Trip Volunteers in developing countries.

There have been some changes in the markets we use for the recycled glasses, sunglasses, glass cases, paired lenses, etc that Lions Clubs collect, if it is convenient – please sort out these items before bringing your glasses, etc to the district Meetings. We no longer have any market for paired lenses, hard glass cases, clip on eyeglass sun shades and damaged plastic frames. We still have a need for used eye glasses, new unfinished optical lens blanks, clean soft cases, new demonstration optical frames, either metal or plastic. We will continue to make pickups at the 35 O District Meetings.

Dr. Mauger, who has been with the Lions Community Eye Clinic for 9 ½ years has

retired, December 9, 2015 was his last clinic. We wish him the best of health and happiness in the future! The PRTS Board has been interviewing replacements for his position. We do have a doctor commitment for the January 13, 2016 Clinic. Sue Lewis, the organizer of the Lions Community Eye Clinic has resigned.

she had been the licensed optician that dispensed the glasses. We have had several opticians assisting with the dispensing of the glasses. We are optimistic that by the February 9, 2016 Clinic, we will have a doctor on board!

As with most volunteer projects, the more successful you become, your budget usually needs a little boost – so keep PRTS in mind as you make your donations.

Keep collecting those glasses, and other items from the list above; consider sending a client to the LCEC and invite a PRTS Board member to one of your meetings to hear about one aspect of the amazing work we do in 35 O!

Update On The Sight First Grant PDG Norma Callahan



We filed our report in November and just received our second year funds. We have also received our third camera. It is important to get the camera scheduled if you have the

following criteria: 1) dark space, 2) large enough past history of good turnout,

3) ability to provide adequate staff to do blood sugar screening and vision acuity. 4) Contact me to locate a certified retina screener.

We are in process of updating our training manual and protocol. We will be working with the Florida Diabetic Camps as well as the Pediatric Endo Diabetic clinics in St Petersburg, Tampa as well as Gainesville. We will not, unless no blood sugar has been taken that day, conduct BS screening. If the Event conducts BS screening on the children we will take the reading from their pumps or meters. Our consent form will be changed for these events.

The form will be changed for these events. This will also be true if we are working in a diabetic clinic and they have their current readings available for us.

We have at this time the following Certified Retina Screeners: Ruth Hyatt, Donna Norton, Steve Norton, Vivian Henegar, Glenn Brown, Jackie Cameron, Betsey Messer, and Joel Levenston. The following are in process of their training some only need one more: John Thomas, David Skillin, Betty Berrea, Pat Block, and GeorgeAnn Grant.

Retina screener training includes the following: 1) take a retina screening with the trainer working closely with a trainer of at least 7 to 10 images that are gradable at 90%. 2) Conduct the retina screener again 7 to 10 images and before uploading have the trainer review. Again must have 90% readable. 3) Conduct a retina screening without a trainer of 7 to 10 and have 90% gradable.

We have others interested in training so we are working on this and will be asking you to complete the schedule and I will get back if I can provide a certified retina screener.

Please return the forms back as soon as you have completed the screening. Our data base is large and it is important to us to have a review so if there is an error is does not continue. When I find an error I

will return it to the team leader with the mistake highlighted. Please make sure the team leader has their email on the report form. This has been added.

We will be updating our form to rev 9 on 1/1/16. If you use Rev 8, no change in questions just removing the insurance name and eye doctor name.

Please ask the patient questions they skip. We want a good report going in to LCIF. Remember these consent forms are money. We need to do an outstanding job and show them we are proud to be a pilot for such a very important new project under Sight First.
