Hello from 1st Vice District Governor Helene

Fellow Lions

One of our great partnerships in MD 35 is with KidSight. This is a valuable program that I wanted to make sure you are aware of.

What is KidSight? It is a free screening program to detect vision problems that can lead to Amblyopia in kids up to 6 years old.

Why do we partner with KidSight? Amblyopia (lazy eye) is not always apparent to the adults in a child's life. And children are very good at compensating, so this condition can go undetected until it's too late to correct it. There are estimates that 1 in 20 children has some level of Amblyopia, and these children are at risk for poor performance, low self-esteem and limited social and sports involvement. Or worse, 7 out of 10 juvenile delinquents have an undiagnosed vision problem.



How do we partner with KidSight? Our local Clubs have trained volunteers that go to schools, churches and day care centers to take pictures of the children's eyes with the special Plusoptix "camera". The camera generates a picture and a pass or refer classification.

Is your Lions Club already participating in this program? If yes, great. And I have really good news. In the Lions Year 2018-2019 you will have a KidSight Chair, Lion Chuck LeGare of the Lake Sumter Lions Club. Please be sure to let Lion Chuck know when you are doing events and the results so he can report on our District's efforts at our District Advisory Meetings. He can be reached at cplegare@gmail.com or 319-325-3305.

If you are not participating in the program, there are options:

You can partner with a nearby Club with the Plusoptix unit to screen children in your community.

Your Club can purchase a Plusoptix unit and have your Lions trained to use it.

You can apply for a grant for a Plusoptix unit.

Tips for Being an Effective Treasurer

- Develop and enforce strong internal controls and financial management policies
- Ensure accurate and complete financial reporting and proper maintenance of financial records and information/tax returns
- Regularly assess risks and whether and how such risks should be mitigated
- Keep a calendar of filing requirements and deadlines and have clear assignments (with backups) to help ensure they are all met in a timely manner
- Have the organization's financials audited whenever required or advisable

Traps to Avoid

- Neglect to wisely limit access to and control of the organization's funds
- Fail to keep and share with the board accurate and timely financial records
- Treat the Form 990 merely as a financial report and not a critical marketing communication
- Give legal or tax advice to donors about the deductibility of contributions

Dear Lion Leaders,

Starting on June 30, 2018, **dues credits for membership drops will** not **be issued** after the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1. In the past, Lions Clubs International has given clubs a grace period in January and July to adjust their club rosters and receive a credit for unreported membership drops. This practice has been a courtesy extended to clubs by Lions International despite rules governing the practice in Board Policy. The board of directors recently decided that enforcement of existing policy is necessary in order to be in compliance with Board Policy.

This will also provide greater alignment with district billing and create more accurate reporting that better reflects true membership growth. We realize that this will have an impact on some clubs, so we would like you to help them prepare for the upcoming billing cycle.

Here are a few best practices that can help you prepare your clubs for their July dues billing:

- Remind club officers to update their membership rosters using MyLCI or their regional reporting system.
- **Encourage** club officers to submit their membership roster to MyLCI or their local reporting system prior to **June 30, 2018 CDT.**
- Inform current and incoming leaders that membership dues credits will no longer be issued.







Directions for Completing and Submitting

Application Requesting Assistance for Surgery

Attention: When completing and submitting the Application Requesting Assistance for Surgery, the Projects Form must also be completed at the same time.

- 1. No after-the-fact cases will be accepted.
- 2. The sponsoring club pays for examination(s), if possible.
- 3. The Foundation only pays amounts approved on surgical cases.
- 4. The Medical Agencies bills MD-35 Projects Chairperson. This information is provided to them on the Authorization Form when the case is approved.

- 5. When you receive a request for financial assistance for surgery, **complete in full** both the Projects Form and the Financial Eligibility Application form with necessary signatures using the Poverty Level Schedule as a guideline. Both forms must be completed!
- 6. All clients must apply for assistance from the Division of Blind Services (DBS) and Vocational Rehab before coming to the Foundation. If they are denied assistance from DBS or Voc Rehab, have them get a letter stating reason for denial and submit it with the application. The Foundation does not get involved with clients who have Medicare, Medicaid, or any other form of insurance.
- 7. Your club's co-payment must accompany the required forms when submitting a request for assistance. Please make the check payable to: The Florida Lions Foundation for the Blind, Inc. The requested amount is \$200.00 per surgical case for either **one or two eyes**.
- 8. Please attach a copy of the patient's social security card or a copy of their Green Card if applicable to the forms.

9. EMERGENCY CASES:

- A. Clubs with emergency cases must immediately notify District Projects Chairperson.
- B. One-eye cataract cases are not emergency cases.
- C. Esotropia, exotropia, and lazy eye are emergencies only for ages 5 and under.
- 10. If a case is not completed within 6 months following approval, it will be cancelled.

Note: Your assistance in making sure all information needed is provided on the forms will greatly expedite the process. Please remember that it is not the responsibility of the Projects Chairperson to acquire the client's information. It is our responsibility to try to negotiate costs with medical agencies once we receive the precise procedure to be done with the code numbers and the estimated costs.

The Foundation is here to assist all Lions Clubs in Florida and The Bahamas.



Second Vice-District Governor Vacancy

A meeting has been scheduled for Friday, May 4, 2018 at 1:00 PM at the 2018 MD-35 Lions of Florida and the Bahamas 94th Convention to be held at the Wyndham Hotel and Convention Center; 8001 International Drive; Orlando, FL to select/accept a recommendation for Second Vice-District Governor to the International Board of Directors.

The purpose of this meeting is to appoint a qualified club member as Second Vice-District Governor for the 2018-2019 Lionistic year and will consist of the existing cabinet as provided for in the International Constitution and By-Laws and all past international officers who are members in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in the district. Each Lion that is entitled to attend and vote at this meeting may make one (1) nomination of his/her choice from the floor.

In order for a Lion to be eligible and qualified to be selected to fill the vacancy of Second Vice-District Governor, he/she must:

- 1. Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district
- 2. Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as Second Vice-District Governor
 - a. As officer of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and
 - b. As a member of the district cabinet for a full term or major portion thereof
 - c. With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

Each such nominee shall be entitled to one (1) seconding speech, only, on his/her behalf of not more than three (3) minutes in duration and may speak personally for five (5) additional minutes. When each nominee has had an opportunity to present his/her remarks, the chairperson shall declare nominations closed. No additional nominations shall be accepted after the close of nominations.

Voting:

- 1. Voting will occur immediately after the close of nominations
- 2. Voting will be by written ballot
- 3. The member shall indicate his/her vote by written ballot. Any ballot containing votes for more than one (1) nominee shall be declared invalid.
- 4. A majority vote shall be necessary to recommend a member for appointment.

At the conclusion of the meeting, a written report of the voting results will be forwarded to the international office.
