

I was just preparing to send my

message to you when a devastating earthquake struck Nepal. Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) immediately granted a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe grant for relief and reconstruction efforts. This is a frightening

"A New Leash on Life"

Recently graduated Jamie Dolan has returned home to St. Petersburg with his new yellow Labrador guide, Landin, where they've joined Ryan, his Vizsla from Southeastern Guide Dogs that retired about a year ago after eight wonderful years; a frisky little Chihuahua named Gizmo; and Jamie's wife and two teenagers.

Jamie knew all along that Landin would fit right in. He's "incredibly smart, very affectionate, and amazing,"

according to Jamie. Landin and Jamie are already like "two peas in a pod," and have the same strong-willed personalities.

Jamie lost his sight in an instant

back in November 2004, when a gunman entered the Radio Shack store where he was a manager trainee and opened fire, killing two and severely wounding Jamie before taking his own life. With help from Ryan first and now Landin,

A FOUNDATION FOR YOUR LIONS CLUB

The Council of Governors has approved the free distribution of instructions and associated documents that will assist Lions Clubs in creating their own club-level, tax-exempt Foundation using the new IRS 1023-EZ short application form. This package is only for establishing new club-level 501c3 Foundations that have less than \$50,000 annual income and total assets under \$250,000. It can be used to reinstate those Foundations who have lost their tax-exempt status, but it is not for Clubs that have lost their 501c4 tax status.

Requests for the instruction manual should be made by e-mail; distribution will be made via electronic transfer in .pdf format and subject to the following provisions:

- 1. The instruction manual and related documents are not to be considered legal advice; the user takes full responsibility for the security of the material.
- 2. The instruction manual can be used solely by the Lions Club requesting the material and it shall not be distributed to any person or organization.
- 3.The material is being distributed free of cost. If the Lions Club decides to use the material to apply for their tax-exempt status, a suggested donation of \$100.00 will be made to the Florida Lions Foundation for the Blind; this can be applied to a Life Membership.
- 4.Following the delivery of the material, the Lions Club has 60 days to decide to use the material; after that, it shall be destroyed. This is a security issue, you can re-order.
