Greetings from 2nd Vice District Governor Greg Evans



October was a special month for my wife and myself. We celebrated our 25th Wedding Anniversary with a trip of a life time to Hawaii.

In the beginning of the month, before our trip, I was able to visit a few clubs that I had not been to in a while. Visiting clubs this year has become my favorite thing to do. I learn so much from other clubs in our District and Multiple Districts. I have found most clubs are unique and all clubs have special things about them that I wish could be relayed to others. By visiting other clubs, you tend to pick up on things that can help your club, yourself or another club.

When you are visiting please consider a few things. *Take notes and write things down.* Write down the ideas you heard. Write down the names of Lions who said something interesting that you would like to know more of. Introduce yourself to them after the meeting and exchange contact information. Follow up with these Lions in the following week and ask questions. Invite them to help you, they will be happy to do so. Lions love it when you ask for their help and expertise. Another thing to do when visiting clubs is to listen to their needs and issues. Maybe you can help them. Are they going through something that your club has done and solved? Do you have a fresh approach or solution to something they are talking about? When giving advice, do not be discouraged by negative people, in any Lions Group there will be a small percentage of naysayers and they can sometimes sound like they are acting for the whole group. This is where you pay attention to the positive Lions and the ones who may be receptive to newer, different, improving or trying things with a different approach. Remember “What you focus on expands” be positive, stay positive when visiting other clubs. Remember our Lions Mission Statement “To empower volunteers to serve their communities, meet humanitarian needs, encourage peace and promote international understanding through Lions Clubs”. When I read the mission statement, it tells me to do what I ever I can for other Lions, helping them achieve their goals. So, I look beyond any negative to help whom I can.

As a club, official visitations are visitations with 4 or more of your members. Each Lions club is asked to do at least two a year. As an official club visitation, it makes the other club feel special that you would want to do this. Try visiting clubs outside your Zone, as you see these clubs at Zone meetings. You will be pleasantly surprised by what you learn by picking new clubs you have never been to before. Make it a point to ask the club if you can visit. This is important because we all have some meetings that already are full or worse yet maybe a meeting has been postponed and you would be meeting a club that is not there.

YOU'VE GOT MAIL!

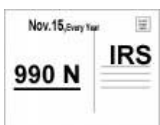
The first email program was developed in 1971. Forty-six years later we've all heard the phrase "You've Got Mail" and we recognize it means email. Lions are using email to communicate with one another on a daily basis. Lions Club International is using email to communicate with Lions around the world. Our District Newsletter and Multiple District Magazine are now sent via email as are important notices, announcements, meeting registration forms, event flyers, etc.

We currently have 1,397 Lions in District 35-O. Of these, 956 have email addresses in MyLCl. *Unfortunately that means 441 Lions, or 1/3 of the Lions, in our District are not receiving important communications unless someone is taking an extra step to provide it to them.*

Club Secretaries, please make a concentrated effort between now and the end of the year to add missing email addresses to MyLCl. It is also a good idea to validate that address in MyLCl are correct. If you have several members, at the club or zone level, that have access to a computer but do not know how to use email why not schedule a class on how to sign up for a free email program and the basics of how to use it?

Filing Form 990-N (e-Postcard)

With The IRS by NOV. 15th

Please remember that all Lions Clubs, Districts and Multiple districts that have annual gross receipts less than \$50,000 and do not have to file Form 990 or 990-EZ, must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). *The 990 N e-Postcard (electronic postcard -filed online) is due every year by the 15th day of November.*

Cabinet Treasurer Rita Talks Money



Being your treasurer is a privilege and I do not take my duties lightly. Working with each club to get their MD and District dues paid is relatively easy. Most clubs send the money immediately; however, we have a few that drag their feet.

Getting the Emergency Grant monies from Lions Clubs International and then getting the money to Lion Mary Yochum can be challenging. The US Mail is not the fastest way to send things but it gets the job done.

On October 6, we received \$20,000 from Lions Club International to help those in need from Hurricane Irma. Lion Mary Yochum is our Disaster Relief Chair and is doing a wonderful job disbursing these funds. Lion Mary is purchasing tarps, non-perishable foods, water, plastic bags and gift cards to give to those in need. Lion Mary is welcoming Lion Dan Fox who is working Disaster Relief in Zones 1-5, allowing her time to work Zones 6-10.

We have only 30 days to disburse these funds. Please check with Lion Mary or Lion Dan to offer help with disbursing these funds. Emailing is probably the best way to reach them:

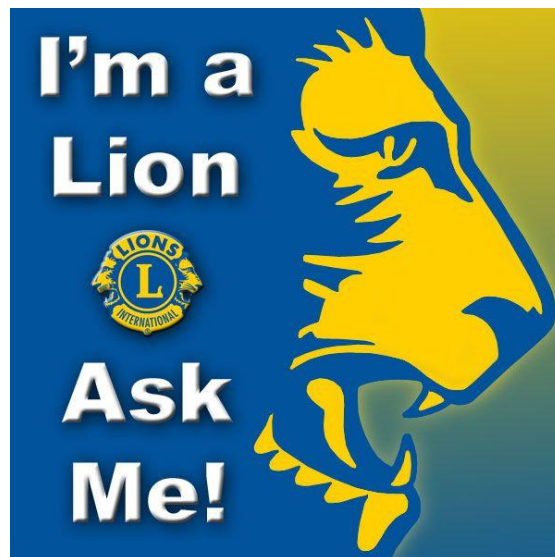

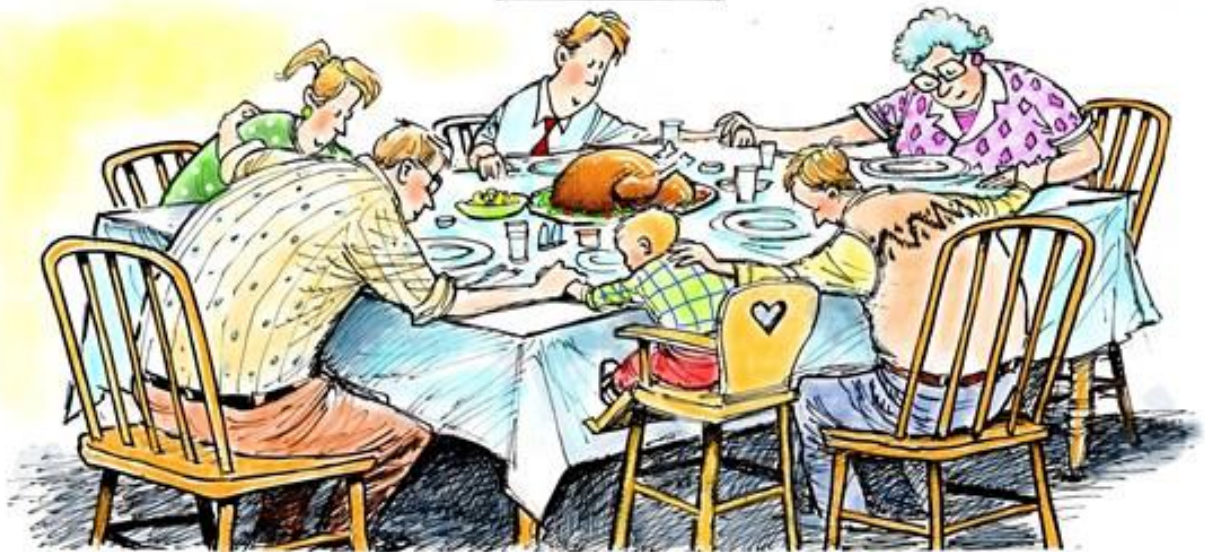
Cabinet Treasurer Lion Rita's Spouse

Dear Lions,

When service projects are too large for a club or a district to financially support, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is there to assist. A great example of Lions and LCIF working together happens in the midst of disaster.

This summer, the world watched as natural disasters struck around the world. In South Asia, parts of India, Nepal and Bangladesh are experiencing devastating monsoon rains. In Mumbai alone, over 1,000 people have been reported killed in the floods. In the past 3 months, LCIF has approved 20 emergency grants to South Asia, totaling US\$125,000. In July, flooding in Japan took lives and destroyed homes. LCIF awarded a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant to help the community recover.

In August, Hurricane Harvey devastated the Texas coast stretching from the Houston area into Louisiana. During one of the worst natural disasters in American history, thousands of people lost their homes and everything they own. Some people lost family members. LCIF immediately awarded a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant to assist in reconstruction efforts. Within two weeks of Hurricane Harvey, Hurricane Irma struck Florida and other areas of the Southeast United States, and destroyed much of the islands in the western Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea. At the same time, Mexico was hit by its strongest earthquake in 100 years. LCIF has made funds available for two more US\$100,000 grants to aid Lions assisting with Hurricane Irma and Mexico's earthquake. Most recently, LCIF awarded a US\$100,000 grant to support Puerto Rico hurricane relief and reconstruction in the wake of Hurricane Maria.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to the individuals affected by these and other natural disasters. At the same time, LCIF issues a heartfelt thank you to our donors. Please consider joining them and making a contribution. Donations will continue Lions' relief efforts around the world, and no gift is too small.

From March 25 through April 1, 2018, come meet your fellow Lions in Andalucía, Spain,

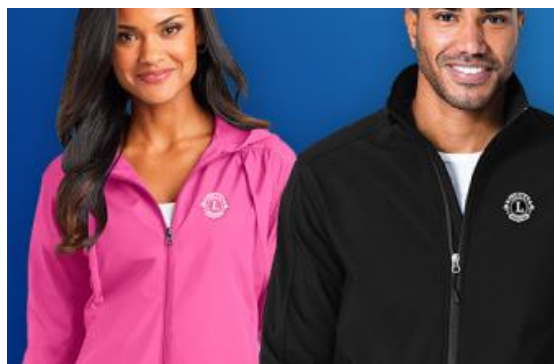

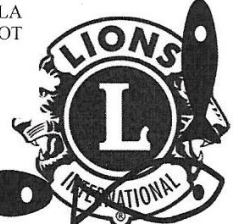

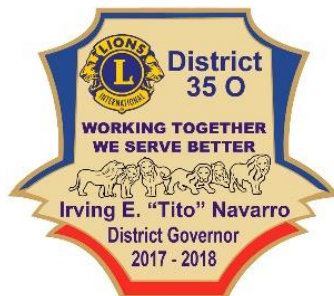
