Get on the bus! We will have have fun and make a difference in our communities and the world by being part of serving part of the 100 million in the years before the centennial anniversary of LCI.



Filing Form 990-N (*e-Postcard*) With The IRS by NOV. 15th (Final Reminder!)

Tax-exempt organizations whose <u>gross</u> <u>receipts</u> are <u>normally</u> \$50,000 or less must file Form 990-N with the IRS. The 990 N e-Postcard(electronic postcard filed online) is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of tax year. (See last months <u>newsletter</u> for more detail).

IMPORTANT

Solicitation of Contributions

The Solicitation of Contributions Act requires anyone who solicits donations from people in the state of Florida to register with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and renew annually. The department collects registration fees and has authority to impose penalties for noncompliance. The department provides financial disclosure regarding organizations on the online <u>Gift Givers' Guide</u> or information about a specific charity may be obtained by calling the Consumer Assistance Call Center at 1-800-HELP-FLA (435-7352), or out of state at (850) 410-3800.

WHEN IS YOUR CLUB'S SOLICITATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS RENEWAL DUE?

Unlike the *Federal* 990 N e-Postcard due date which is determined based on the last day of an organizations fiscal year (all Lions Club's end their fiscal year on the same day-June 30th) the *STATE of FLORIDA* Solicitation of Contributions renewal *is annual based on the date of a club's original registration*. Therefore club renewal dates differ! Each club must know their own date. A renewal notice is sent from the State of Florida but it is still important to know when to expect the renewal notice and call to find out what happened if your club doesn't receive a notice on time! Penalty for late renewal is

Not only must a club renew annually but there are requirement that must be followed such as the posting of Disclosure Notices, Conflict of Interest policies, etc. New more stringent laws were passed effective July 1, 2014.

\$25 per month or portion of a month.
