A Desktop (Screen) Shortcut to any site you visit often is easy to make and fun to use! Would you like a quick and easy way to access MyLCI? Just follow these steps:

- 1) Select an empty spot on your desktop screen and right click. (The first screen you see when your computer comes on.)
- 2) Click on NEW. Then click on SHORTCUT.
- 3) Type (Or copy/ paste) the site address into the "*Type Location of the Item*" box. For MyLCI use:

- 4) Click on NEXT.
- 5) Type a name for this new shortcut in the box. (Suggestion: MyLCI)
- 6) Click on FINISH
- 7) Locate the shortcut on your desktop and click it to test.

This year's late July visit also included past international directors, trainers, and several local Lions who volunteered to help serve.

About 40 people enjoyed the experience and a good time was had by all!
On Friday, attendees enjoyed a "State of the School" address from CEO Titus Herman and a presentation from Lion Sue Spicer and her guide dog Mason. Guests then enjoyed the warm Florida evening and a catered



dinner in our Freedom Pavilion.

On Saturday, everyone toured the new Keith G. Hirst Canine Assessment Center, a project made possible by generous Florida Lions and the matching gifts of the Lions Clubs International Foundation (totaling nearly \$200,000!!).

Joel Clark, Southeastern Guide Dogs' Director of Information Management and Capital Projects, spoke to guests about the many uses of the Center. As a puppy raiser and a breeder host, Joel speaks with infectious enthusiasm and was asked to come speak at the District 35-O Cabinet Meeting in November.

Next, the group toured campus with




volunteer tour guides Lion Anne Brown and Lion Phil Courtright. The group hugged puppies at the puppy kennel before heading to the training kennel, where Canine Care Technicians (CCTs) shared about guide dogs in training. Some of the visitors experienced a "blindfold walk," which consists of donning a blindfold, holding a harness, and allowing a guide dog to lead them.

Filing Form 990-N (e-Postcard) With The IRS Tax-exempt organizations

whose gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less must file Form 990-N with the IRS. The 990 N e-Postcard (electronic postcard -filed online) is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of tax year. For example, when your tax year ends on June 30th, the e-Postcard is due Nov 15th. If the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the date is the (Continued next page...)






