



Over the weekend of July 29th and 30th the first Cabinet/ Member Meeting of 2022-2023 was held in Elko Nevada. The Elko Lions Club hosted the event at Stockmen's Hotel Casino. After a couple of glitches at check-in for some members, the event went off well. Good company, good food, and Lions Fellowship abounded.


Well done Elko Lions.

Friday evening had members gather for cocktail hour and dinner. Saturday morning's meetings began at 8 am with the Cabinet roll call taking place at 10 am. The Installation of Officers was emceed by PCC Lion Irving Confino of LV Black Mountain Lions. Lion Irv went above and beyond by using the Aloha theme in his presentation. 2022-2023 DG Kimo Harward is a founding member of LV Aloha Lions.

1st VDG Adam Hopkins led the speakers off with the State of the District Report. 41 of 42 clubs in D46 are in Good Standing. We lost no clubs over the last year and we have 6 new Guiding Lions. He encourages anyone with the calling to become one. It's easy! Only 11 of 42 clubs reported their activities. Let's "get gas on the fire" and report! It is so important.

CT Stephanie Covert reported on the state of our finances, all good! Included in her report were \$11,501 in our Disaster Relief Fund and \$27,090 in the Special Activities fund.

DG Kimo Harward's theme is "Balance the Scales." Balancing the scales between these activities: Membership, Leadership, Service, LCI Foundation. Our clubs can use virtual meetings to reach those unable to attend in person while having fun. Lions change the world. He urges all of us to wear our Lions gear, to engage the public. Lions - "We Serve".

Other highlights from the Committee Reports: PDG Barry Temple reported on D46 Contribution to Campaign 100. In 2017 our goal was to raise \$187,000; we raised \$200,893! The top 5 clubs contributing were LV Host, Reno Host, LV Breakfasters, LV Black Mountain and Carson City Host. 27 of 42 clubs participated. PDG Rex Velasquez reported that our membership is up to 996 in D46 and 48% contributed to LCIF. PID Jack Epperson introduced us to 2022-2023 International President Brian Sheehan. He talked a bit about the IP's theme - "Together We Can".

Dinner was served in the ballroom. Lion Ken Petri auctioned off a beautiful Lion painting, in a Polish auction, raising \$1,000 for the Student Speaker Foundation. The painting was donated to PCS Judi Temple by the family of a former Lion who was recently deceased.

DID YOU KNOW?



Did you know that on October 8-10, 1917, at the first convention of Lions International, a vote was taken and a measure approved to amend the by-laws and admit business women as full members?

This measure was rescinded during the second convention in St. Louis, MO in 1918.

A woman had been admitted into the Austin Downtown Founder Lions Club (Texas), based on the approved measure, but was “dismissed” at the third convention in 1919.

Women were not officially allowed as full members until 1987 although a few clubs had secretly allowed women members in with one being a member since 1980.

“Where there is a need there is a Lion.” A perfect description of who we are and what we do.

I had the opportunity to tour the grounds of St Jude’s Ranch for Children in Boulder City. I have volunteered in the past to take part in events, through our Lions Club, and spend time with the kids who are remarkable and inspiring. I fell in love with the work that is done there for the sake and safety of the Children.

The Ranch was created for “transforming the lives of abused and at-risk children, young adults and families by empowering them to create new chances, new choices and new hope in a caring community environment.” The dedicated staff, counselors and support groups do their jobs well. My heart was inspired to do something for the children that would make an impact, however small, on them.

The children come to the Ranch as a safe- haven while awaiting adoption or a foster home to welcome them in. They arrive with all their worldly possessions in a trash bag. When they leave, again, put their clothes and personal articles in another trash bag and move on. As a Lion I saw a need for these children and started a campaign to collect luggage that they could store their “stuff” in when they moved on to start the next chapter of their lives. We collected over 200 no longer used pieces from peoples attics, closets, garages, and storage units. It is a great feeling to know that something so mundane and unused could give a hand up to a child’s sense of self-worth and self-esteem.

***” This Fall ground will be broken to create a new campus. Leveraging more than a 50-year history of providing residential care to children and young people that have experienced complex trauma, St. Jude’s Ranch for Children will create the Healing Center, the first of its kind program for the specialized care of child victims of sex trafficking. The Healing Center will offer trauma specific treatment to victims with a goal to have them move along the continuum of healing, from victims to survivors, and then thriving in our community. understanding of the victimization they have experienced, improve self-esteem, develop and/or enhance motivation for change, improve life skills and empower them to reach life goals.”**

What a wonderful opportunity to introduce the Lions Quest program into the educational curriculum.

As leader for the Lions Quest Program for Nevada I intend working to recognize opportunities for introduction of this valuable service to children and young people We have a lot of work to do and it can only be done by the efforts of caring Lions and their clubs.




Lions Club provides free vision screening in Lincoln County

Bob and Myrtle Knipes brought their vision screening technology to Pioche in hopes of helping someone in need. The free screening, sponsored by Lions Club, took place at the Pioche Senior Center June 11-12. “A child who starts school needing glasses is a day behind when they start,” said Bob. He added that most vision problems can be fixed if they are detected before the age of seven.


Myrtle was the reason the couple, who have been married 67 years, first joined Rachel’s Lions Club. When Myrtle was around nine years old, the Lions Club screened her eyes. “They got me my first set of glasses, so ever since I have helped out in whatever way I could,” said Myrtle. Her grades improved dramatically after receiving her glasses.

“She is the poster girl for the Lions,” said Bob.

About 12 years ago, the Knipes’ screening began in Lincoln County. The Lions Club had traveled to Alamo to screen eyes at the senior center, and Brian Higbee was receiving a donated bicycle from the Lions Club when he saw the vision screening taking place. According to Bob, Higbee asked if they screened kids and “went back and brought a bus full of kids up. That’s when we got started... It just grew from there.” Bob Knipes is a certified screener for KidSight USA, a nationwide program that ensures children have access to vision screenings and follow-up care. Since 2019, the Lions Club has screened nearly 300 people in Lincoln County. “We feel like we are helping people that are underprivileged, that can’t afford to go to a doctor to check these things,” said Myrtle.

Children can be screened as young as six months old. Bob stresses that as screeners, they are not doctors. The technology notifies the screener if someone should see a doctor. Then, the Lions SightFirst Foundation of Southern Nevada is able to provide funding to cover the potential cost of glasses, surgery, exams and transportation to see a specialized doctor. Many referrals go to Dr. Peter DeBry, an ophthalmology specialist in the Las Vegas area.

At the Pioche Senior Center, the Knipes screened 24 people. Four adults were referred to doctors. “It’s very worthwhile to me,” said Bob. “I get a kick out of helping people.”





**The Story of Lions -
Most know it, new members should learn it.
A little refresher for us all.**



Our Story

1917 The Beginning // Chicago business leader Melvin Jones asked a simple and world-changing question – what if people made a commitment to improving their communities? More than a century later, Lions Clubs International is the largest service club organization in the world, with more than 1.4 million members in 48,000 clubs acting on the same simple idea – when Lions come together for the good of humanity, there’s nothing we can’t achieve.

1920 Going International // Just three years after our founding, Lions became international when we established the first club in Canada. Mexico followed in 1927. In the 1950s and 1960s, international growth accelerated, with new clubs in Europe, Asia and Africa.

1925 Saving Sight // Helen Keller addressed the Lions Clubs International Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio, USA, and challenged Lions to become “knights of the blind.” Since then, we have worked tirelessly to aid those who are blind or visually impaired.

1945 Uniting Nations // We were one of the first nongovernmental organizations invited to assist in the drafting of the United Nations Charter. We host an annual Lions Day with the United Nations to continue our partnership and identify global solutions to the challenges facing humanity.

1957 Organizing Youth Programs // We started the Leo program to provide the youth of the world with an opportunity to serve and lead with Lions. There are approximately 180,000 Leos and 7,200 Leo clubs in more than 140 countries worldwide.

1968 Establishing Our Foundation // Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) assists Lions with global and large-scale humanitarian projects. Through our global Foundation, Lions have received more than US\$1 billion in grants to help meet the needs of their local and global communities.

1990 Launching SightFirst // Through the support of LCIF, Lions are restoring sight and preventing blindness on a global scale with the SightFirst program. Launched in 1990, Lions have raised more than US\$351 million for this initiative that targets the major causes of blindness.

2017 Celebrating Our Centennial // Lions celebrate a century of service by serving more than 250 million people around the world through a special Centennial Service Challenge.

2018 Rallying Around Global Causes // Lions unite to support the global causes of vision, hunger, the environment, childhood cancer and our new global focus, diabetes. LCIF launches *Campaign 100: LCIF Empowering Service* to raise US\$300 million to increase the service impact of Lions around the world.

2020 Responding to COVID-19 // Lions found innovative ways to safely serve their communities during this global health crisis. Our global Foundation, LCIF, donated millions of dollars in emergency grant funds, providing critical supplies and equipment to hospitals, medical clinics and emergency management systems, including front-line health care workers and first responders.



Lions Clubs International
