I'm excited to share a behind-the-scenes peek at how you help turn researchers' ideas into lifesaving scientific breakthroughs.

Every patient at City of Hope has a team of hundreds on their side, working to give them a second chance. <u>The entire</u> <u>drug development process — from lab bench to bedside — happens right here on campus,</u> which is one of the things that makes City of Hope so special.

It all starts with a lightbulb moment. A **researcher** has an idea, and he or she takes it to our oncampus **chemists.** Together, they design a drug. And then our **manufacturing team** comes into play, making the drug and ensuring it passes all Food and Drug Administration standards

After researchers test the drug in the lab, it's time for clinical trials. So our **pharmacologists** get involved, figuring out how the human body will process the drug. City of Hope even has a **mathematical oncologist**, which is extremely rare. He weighs in from a data perspective, analyzing the results and making adjustments. And finally, the drug arrives at the **patient's** bedside, helping to save a life.

As a City of Hope supporter, you make it all possible — from a researcher's lightbulb moment to a lifesaving clinical trial. <u>I hope you enjoy learning more about your support in action.</u>

Airport dedication to naming the Winnemucca Municipal Airport - Airfield after our Lifetime Lion member Leon Franklin.

The Winnemucca Municipal Airport Board unanimously approved dedicating their airfield to Lt. Colonel Irl Leon Franklin, USAF (Ret) for his 30 years of volunteer service, including 20 years as chairman of the airport board. During his years of service he has managed to obtain \$22 million dollars in FAA grant funding awarded to the airport as well as initiating the Winnemucca Civil Air Patrol program after the need was identified.

The stone will be paid for by funds privately raised and will not affect the cost sharing agreement between the city and county or taxpayer dollars. Winnemucca Host Lions Club kicked off the collection for the stone by donating \$250.00 toward the approximate


