


District Governor Mel's Biography





MD-20 PDG Leadership Achievement Award Program

Purpose:

This award was initiated by the MD-20 PDG Organization to encourage and recognize outstanding examples of leadership by Lions Club members of MD-20.

Criteria for the Award:

Candidates for the award shall have demonstrated outstanding leadership qualities in the following areas:

- Unselfish contributions of time, talent, and resources for the advancement of Lionism at the Club and/or District level.
- Significant examples of leadership of a Lions Club at the Club and/or District level.
- 3. A sustained period of involvement in Lions Clubs activities (not a one shot deal). While no service minimum has been set for the award, it is generally accepted that the winner will have served the organization for several years. NOTE: Clubs that wish to honor Lions for specific reasons or for one specific year have many other award choices at their disposal.
- Significant accomplishments in service, fundraising, and other major Lions activities.
- Involvement in Lions events beyond the Club, such as conference, forum, and convention participation.
- Development of unique approaches to club projects and problem solving.

Method of Selection:

Nominations from clubs in each sub-district are forwarded to the selection committee of Past District Governors in their respective district. The committee will select a candidate who best meets the criteria for the award. No Lions shall submit his/her own name. Nominations shall be in writing on forms provided.

Eligibility:

All Lions in good standing are eligible, except the current District Governor, all Past District Governors, all previous award recipients, and all candidates for District Governor, 1st Vice District Governor, or 2nd Vice District Governor in the year of the award.



Churchville Lion PID John Rabideau (Ret.) Takes Off in Honor Flight

Honor Flight Rochester (HFR) Mission 78 flew the weekend of June 17th-18th. Sixty veterans attended including 5 Cold War veterans, 2 Cold War/Vietnam War veterans, 52 Vietnam War veterans and 1 Post Vietnam War veteran. Their branches of service are: Army (26), Navy (20), Marines (12) and Air Force (2).

Honor Flight was created to honor America's veterans for their sacrifices. They fly their heroes to Washington, DC to visit and witness memorials created to honor the lives of those they once fought alongside. Honor Flight is a not-for-profit and free to all American veterans.

On Saturday, June 17th, Mission 78 departed the Greater Rochester International Airport at 6 AM and returned to Rochester on Sunday the 18th at 1:15 PM.

On the flight to D.C. PID Lion John commented on a special remembrance in his own words: "One of the highlights of the trip was 'Mail Call!' Each veteran on Mission 78 received four letters from students in the surrounding school districts. I say four because that was what I received. My letters were filled with 'Thank You's' and questions regarding my time in service. The students that participated in 'Mail Call' were third to fifth graders. As I recall receiving my letters I am again overwhelmed with emotion and gratitude for the youngsters that took their time away from whatever 3rd, 4th and 5th graders do to write to us. It means more than you can ever imagine."
