Take Care **of** OUR own

With the virus this year, it has definitely been a challenging year. We all look out for the health and welfare of our families first. We still support the local fire department, church and food pantries. But don't forget to check on your fellow club members who may need some additional help this time of year.

I am writing this article to address something else that is ours, as Lions, and is often overlooked. I am referring to our Lions state projects, the Empire State Special Needs Experience (Lions Camp Badger) and the New York State and Bermuda Lions Foundation. These are our programs and are in need and deserve our personal support. In addition to these local projects, we are part of the international foundation LCIF. My Hilton Lions Club was one year old when the Lions Clubs International Foundation started. Each January for years, we would pass the hat and each put in a personal donation from our own pocket. We were proud of our foundation.

Since 1968 Lions in our district have received financial assistance for Hurricane Relief in Wellsville, Sensory Park in Batavia, Lions Teen Center, Lions Medical Loan Closet, Health and Wellness Center at an Elementary School, Mobile Eye Screening Van, Eye Surgery Unit, Expansion of Diabetes Center, Construction of Low Vision Exam Room, Dental X-ray equipment, and Challenger Miracle Field. These are all projects that our fellow Lions in our 20-E1 District thought were important and sought financial help from other Lions who had supported the Lions Foundation, our foundation.

District LCIF Chairman, Tom Bartolini provided me the projects and support we received. We were given \$538,159 for these projects. If you divide that figure by our district membership, that amounts to about \$400 per Lions Club member. Many Lions Clubs now make an annual donation to LCIF from money raised from the public. This is their money. I am not asking anything I have not done. I now have a five diamond LCIF pin. I am asking every Lions to contribute to our foundation personally. Maybe now is the time to show leadership in your club and pass a hat around three times perhaps once a month for Lions Camp Badger, the New York and Bermuda Lions Foundation and Lions Clubs International Foundation.



This year's family had 3 children and 1 adult. Besides the gifts, a Wegmans gift card was donated for the family to purchase needed food items that are not being supplied by the ICC.



Members wrote out 120 holiday greeting cards for the Shire which is an assisted living facility and also purchased gifts for the Salvation Army Holiday drive. Hats, gloves, socks, and scarves for adults and kids were purchased and again this is an ongoing project for the members. The club also made a donation of a fruit basket to the Long Acre Group Home which is located in Irondequoit and has been an ongoing project for over 35 years. Normally we would be attending their holiday party and presenting them with a gift but this year that has been suspended due to Covid 19.



Our Little Free Library has been decorated for Christmas and lots of books for children and adults have been added.

Finally the members would like to wish all Lions and their families a very Happy Hanukkah, Merry Christmas, Happy Kwanza and Happy New Year.
