MD20 Dues Increase is on the Ballot

Dear Lions,

At the 100th Multiple District 20 Convention in Binghamton this May, your Club's delegates will have the responsibility of voting for an important revision to the MD-20 Constitution & By-Laws. The MD20 dues increase was put on the ballot by the Council of Governors last October. The outcome of this vote will have a significant impact on the finances of MD20 and its capability to support the New York State and Bermuda Clubs and Districts. Here is all the information you need to make a sound decision.

Why it is necessary to raise dues

- The last dues increase was in 2011. Since then, we have experienced a slow but constant
 increase in the cost of living which has had an impact on expenses and the formation of the
 yearly budget.
- As costs have increased, the MD-20 membership has declined from 16,557 on 7-1-2011 to 13,126 on 12-31-2023. The loss of membership resulted in a corresponding decline in revenue for both the Multiple District and the individual sub-districts.
- Last October, the Council of Governors tried to balance our books and approved many changes to reduce expenses and increase revenue, including cuts to DG's reimbursements (\$6,500 savings), eliminating the following "Gift Pins": MD20 Flag Ceremony Pins (\$500 savings) and International Parade Pins (\$500 savings), increasing convention booth and registration fees.
- Despite the above changes, the MD20 Budget 2023-24 was approved forecasting an outflow of \$9,525.00.

What is in the <u>ballot</u>

After a lengthy discussion, the Council agreed there was no way to avoid the dues increase and voted to create a ballot item at the 2024 MD20 Convention.

The Council considered several options and decided to adopt the Financial Committee's recommendation to increase the MD 20 dues \$5 in three years: \$1 in 2024, \$2 in 2025, \$2 in 2026.

Final Considerations

- The approval of this recommendation will not only resolve the problem of next year's budget outflow but also stabilize the budget for the years to come, giving time to rebuild the membership to a level sufficient to sustain our districts and clubs.
- · The Council of Governors strongly recommends the approval of the proposed dues increase.



The Avon Lions Club has kicked off the 23-24 with our Toy Drive with serving almost 100 families.



Clarendon Lions Club




