LA Wildfires Raging Wildfires in California Destroy Entire Communities

- Several destructive wildfires swept through the Los Angeles area of California in the United States are devastating entire communities.
- More than 28 people have died, and more than 180,000 people have been evacuated.
- The fires have burned over 50,000 acres and destroyed more than 16,000 structures, including homes, displacing countless families.
- When a humanitarian crisis of this magnitude strikes, we, as Lions, are ready to help. Right beside us is Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), our global foundation.
- LCIF is mobilizing funds, including 2 Emergency Grants awarded and disbursed for \$15,000 each for immediate relief supplies and a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant, to empower Lions in California to help their communities recover.
- Lions in California continue to develop plans.

All of these grants are made possible by our generous donors, including many of you. Did you know we reached a new Planned Giving milestone? We hit the US\$10 million mark, with 275 donors joining the Lions Legacy Society. These gifts, along with other contributions, play a significant role in funding our grants.

Anyone interested in supporting California efforts should make gifts to LCIF's Disaster Fund, noting that their gift is intended for California wildfire relief. LCIF is tracking all gifts made for the California wildfires.

Local Lions are in the process of assessing needs and donations will be used to support their relief efforts. Donors may not restrict donations for a specific club or district.

Global Membership Report January 31, 2025

Dave Markham: District 20-E1 GMT Coordinator

Current State

- Currently, there are 37 Active Clubs in 20-E1 and, and 7 Leo's clubs.
- In 10 of the 37 Club the Membership Chairman's office are listed as vacant.
 They are Albion, Alfred, Angelica, Attica, Gates-Greece, Rochester Flaum,
 Rush, Oakfield-Alabama, Scio and Scottsville.
- As of January 31, District 20-E1 had 21 new members, 1 reinstatement, and 39 drops for a net loss of -18 putting us into a below target for the first half of the FY of 9 net new members for the Mission 1.5 target and 37 for MD 20-E1 target (2 net/club).
- Continuing at the same current growth rate the district would be down 18 net members by FY end.
- Not seeing much response from Club's in filling 10 vacant Membership Chairperson Positions which are critical for a fully functioning club.
- Near term focus has been on club membership recruitment and fixing know issues that impact recruitment.

Next Steps through June 30

- Continue with actions on recruitment and retention.
- Requesting clubs provide exit interviews for any dropped members with the reason for leaving the club and to administer club member satisfaction survey.
- Work with District Leadership and Club Presidents to ensure that all clubs have a membership Chairman's role and responsibilities covered and a current membership plan.
- Provide Literature and presentations for Zone Chairman to utilize on their club visitations.
- Work with district leadership to perform a district wide assessment for opportunities for new or branch clubs.
- Work with District Leadership to see if there is any public relations/advertising the district can create to attract new membership.
- Keep Mission 1.5 in the fore front of the District 20-E1






