Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- . Everyone's invited Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.

#### Board of Directors take steps to help our clubs

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is continuing to impact the work of Lions around the world. As you know, it has also created financial hardships for our Lions and the people for whom we care.


To support the incredible men and women serving with us, the International Board of Directors unanimously passed another resolution to help our clubs.

Here is an overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

- . Charter and entrance fees waiver We have waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.
- Flexible payments No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of
  dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 30, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.
  - Please note that clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those
    clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at
    Lions Clubs International to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

These additional measures will help Lions facing financial hardships and give our clubs the support and encouragement they need during these challenging times. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity, and together, we will overcome this.

The world needs Lions now more than ever, so thank you for your outstanding service and commitment to our communities and the world.

Masks were worn by all workers and at the pickup window in addition to other recommendations by the Orleans County Health department. Along with their dinners, community members received a packet of disposable face masks for their use.

Many Leos came out in support of our recipient as she works at the high school they attend.

Each LC has this type of liaison person. The Diamond Pin given to Lion Colquhoun was an award from the LCIF (February 07, 2021, Text message from Lion Don Colquhoun).

#### **Medical Supply Closet**

Lion Jim Punch reported some medical equipment categories are low, and supplies have to keep moving. "It is becoming apparent that we have the most extensive loan closet in the area, and we want to keep that status" (January 31, 2021, Email from Lion Jim Punch, para. 1 & 3).

On February 1, Lion Punch reported Medina Lions Club Medical Supply Loan Closet started receiving medical supplies (02-01-2021, Email from Lion Jim Punch, para. 1). Volunteers began receiving health care equipment donations in good working order. The lack of storage space prevents the club from accepting

bed parts and items that cannot be loaned-out (Punch, para. 1).

The Medical Supply Closet is in high use, as noted from data obtained from early October 2020 to February 28, 2021, by Lion Jim Hancock. The total number of supplies loaned for this period is 76 items. See table on the right showing highest to lowest items in demand (February 28, 2021, Email from Lion Jim Hancock).

#### **Medina Lions Club**

#### **Vision Screening**

On January 27, 2021, Lion Joe Gorman shared an email titled, "Update for 20E1 SEE Vision Screening Committee." The committee members' shared information and suggested guidelines for performing vision screening. "All vision screening in MD 20 is basically on hold due to COVID school restrictions until the fall since public schools are closed to visitors until then" (January 27, 2021, forwarded email from Joe Gorman, para.1).

The committee suggests all vision screeners wear standard facemasks and gloves in a vented room, preferably with a window open. The child, attended by a teacher, should also wear a facemask. Screeners need to ensure that the screeners will not touch each child. A screener must sanitize the Spot Vision Screener with a cloth disinfectant when starting, finishing, and as needed during a screening event. The committee members expect using the guidelines when screening will compare to pre-COVID timing (Gorman, para.3).


SEE (Screening Eyes Early) and Kidsight USA suggested all future vision screeners will "get a COVID flu shot because it will be a requirement by school systems that all visitors have proof of receiving a COVID flu shot. There should only have at the most 3 Lions on" site "for the Screening" (Gorman, para.3). Screeners and any future screeners, please inform Lions Ann McElwee or Christine Thompson of your COVID vaccine status, so eligible members can do screening in public schools as soon as visitors are allowed.

#### **Community Kitchen**

On Friday, February 5, three Lion members assisted the Community Kitchen at Christ Episcopal Church in Albion. Ann McElwee helped the first shift prepare the meal then, Lions Kelly Squire and Pete Kaiser served and cleaned up.


