



Many Lions assume that the Tooth Fairy is responsible for replenishing the funds in our Lions Foundations after clubs make grant withdrawals. Avon Lion Tom Bartolini has done a great job assisting Lions Clubs completing grant requests so that they have the financial ability to do projects in their community.

During our recent new member orientations in many clubs, the membership chairman stresses that you pay the annual dues on time, and attend the meetings and service projects when you are available. What has been lost is the financial responsibility of being a member of Lions Clubs International. We are expected to personally support <u>our</u> Lions Clubs International Foundation, <u>our</u> New York State and Bermuda Lions Foundation, <u>our</u> camp program The Empire State Special Needs Experience at Lions Camp Badger, <u>our</u> district project at the Batavia School for the Blind, <u>our</u> dog guide programs, <u>our</u> Screening Eyes Early Foundation, <u>our</u> Finger Lakes Region Lions Hearing Foundation and <u>our</u> Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation to name a few.

When your club seeks a \$5000 grant from LCIF to build a community play-ground, or a \$2000 grant from the NYS&BLF to purchase an eye screening camera or even a \$500 grant from SEE to buy braille books for the local library, the expectation is that the club members and club in general will eventually replace the funds that were advanced so that other clubs may borrow for their project. Several of these now hold annual raffles that allow club members to contribute to the foundation and perhaps win something back. A \$10 monthly contribution to one of these programs by each member would go a long way to strengthening the programs we as Lions are so proud of. There is no Tooth Fairy supporting our programs.

LITPC YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION AND GUIDELINES

In June 2026, the Lions International Trading Pin Club will be awarding EIGHT \$4,000 Youth Scholarships to graduating Seniors, who are a child or grandchild of a Lion, Lioness Lion, Lioness, or a member of a Leo Club. The most important aspect of the Youth Scholarship Program is to help young people pursue their education and follow their dreams. dreams.

Selection of the scholarship recipient is based on academic achievement, an essay stating the student's goals, a statement of reason(s) for applying, and an overview of work, community and school service, and letters of recommendation. Applications and supporting documentation are to be mailed to the pin trading club Scholarship Chairman by March 1, 2026. All application from New York State must be first sent to State Chairman PCC James Schiebel, 748 Wiler Road, Hilton, New York,14468 and not to the International Chairman DG Steve Staudinger. New York State is only allowed to forward four applicants for final consideration.



- 1. Completed current 2025-2026 application with all **five essay questions** answered. Each essay should be more than 350 words in length.
- 2. Three Recommendations One of the three must be from a Lion member.
- 3. A certified, signed and stamped **High School Transcript** with all grades.
- 4 A list of extra curricular activities.





have three special






