### *Longswamp Lions Attend MD-14 Pennsylvania Regional Lions Learning Institute (RLLI)*

What a weekend! On March 12-14, 2021, Longswamp Lions Kerry Meitzler and I (Matt Hensinger) attended the Multiple District 14 Regional Lions Leadership Institute at the Red Lion Hotel Harrisburg-Hershey.

Both of us arrived at the event with little idea of what to expect. While I have been a Lion for some time, admittedly, I was not really focused on Lions due to a demanding work schedule in the Pennsylvania Army National Guard and a leadership role in the Hawk Mountain Council, BSA as a volunteer leader. I only made a meeting a month and participated in fund raising. Kerry on the other hand, has only been a Lion for about 18 months; so for the most part, the pair of us had little real knowledge of Lions.

The RLLI training event was well organized and the venue was wonderful. We both want to recognize Past District Governor Deb Burkholder and her RLLI staff for their hospitality and the great work they did at presenting this important information to us. All of the Instructors were very knowledgeable and had wealth of knowledge and depth of Lion experience. They went out of their way to make themselves available to answer questions and share their personal stories.

We also must mention that we appreciate the opportunity to attend this event. Our District Governor Art Pecht recommended we go, all expenses paid. 





The March Foundation Friday webinar dealt with the topics of disaster relief and humanitarian services. Specifically, it dealt with grants that are available through LCIF for these areas.

Starting with some statistics, about 25.3 million people around the world are displaced each year through natural disasters. About 90% of these are water related and they result in a loss of about 275 billion US dollars. Our foundation, LCIF, awards 148 to 160 emergency grants each year and has awarded 130 million US dollars for disaster relief.

Often, when there is a natural disaster, Lions Clubs are the first to arrive and the last to leave.

The webinar included a video narrated by past Council Chair Miriam Vazquez from Puerto Rico concerning hurricane Maria which struck the island in 2017. Much of the island was destroyed. Lions from the United States offered to send food and water, but they could not get items through the ports. Through LCIF, they were able to get an immediate money transfer in order to supply needed food, water, clothing, blankets, etc. There are still 2600 homes today that have blue tarps on the roof and need to be repaired.

Part of the restoration with LCIF grants included repairing a Lions camp in Puerto Rico. Today that camp is serving as a COVID-19 vaccination center.

Under disaster relief, LCIF awards grants in three areas. These are disaster preparedness, emergency relief, and community recovery. Disaster preparedness includes items such as stockpiling of relief goods, disaster kit assembly, and preparedness education. Under this topic, the webinar mentioned a \$10,000 grant awarded in Pennsylvania for the purchase of a disaster relief trailer. This was probably our District 14P under the leadership of PDG Steve Wagner a few years ago. Emergency relief grants are awarded for supplying immediate needs such as water, food, clothing, medicine, blankets, and personal necessities. Community recovery grants are for the restoration needs after the immediate needs are met. This includes equipment for repairs, debris removal, coordination of temporary services, etc.

Since the beginning of COVID-19, LCIF has awarded 353 emergency grants totaling \$5,303,217. I believe this emergency grant program for COVID-19 has ended, but there are matching grants available for items such as major medical equipment.

In the area of humanitarian efforts, the webinar listed a grant for the building of a hospice center in Constitutional Area 1 which is the United States. Also, there was a video highlighting the restoration of the Kaani Lions School in Kenya. Children in this area walk a long way to school and there are few teachers for many children. The Lions of Japan coordinated the restoration of this school, supplied \$450,000 and received an LCIF grant for this restoration. I may be able to show this video at an LCIF display at our coming District 14P convention.

In his email newsletter for this month, our International President, Dr. Jung-Yul Choi writes "we know that giving is part of what it means to be a Lion. And when we contribute to LCIF and Campaign 100 we can help ensure Lions Service for generations to come." He goes on to say that our worldwide Lions projects are possible only with support from Lions like you and me.

Please join me in making a generous donation to LCIF as we approach the end of this Lions year.



### ***Kennett Square Lions Club Food Drive Press Release: Lions Resume Successful Food Drives for KACS***

*From 2009 to Spring 2020, The Kennett Lions held food drives for the Food Cupboard of Kennett Area Community Services. When they were suddenly forced to stop last spring, due to the pandemic, they had completed an impressive 83 food drives in neighborhoods in the Kennett area.*

*From March of 2020, replacing the food drives, the Kennett Lions supported KACS by contributions totaling \$11,500, including a \$2,000 grant from the Lions of Pennsylvania Foundation.*

*Eager to address the food insecurity suffered by many in the community, the Lions judged they could safely resume this activity and once again began their food drives in mid-November 2020. As he has since 2009, Lion Jack Schwartz organized and led a food drive on November 15, 2020 encompassing Bancroft Woods and Pemberton. The Lions collected 881 pounds of food.*

*Encouraged by that success, Lion Jack again led the effort to conduct two more food drives in the first quarter of 2021. On February 24, the Lions collected 886 pounds of food from Chadds Ford Knoll and the Ponds of Woodward, and on March 21, the eighty-sixth food drive, the Lions collected a staggering 965 pounds of food from Longwood Crossing, Victoria Gardens and Longwood Reserve.*

*Thanks to the generosity of these neighborhoods and the efforts of the Lions, KACS Food Cupboard has received a substantial supplement.*



## A Monthly Update of Past District Governors

*My journey in Lions Club began on November 1, 1994, when I joined the Lions Club of Kennett Square. My sponsor was the late PDG Carol Berzon, PDG Carol was the first Lady District Governor in District 14 P. From the day of my induction into the club I*

*knew I had found my purpose. Of course, with a wife and two young children and a business to run, I hesitated at first with the common excuse, "I'm too busy", but I was never too busy for Lions Club. I asked PDG Carol how much it cost to join, and I will never forget her response, "oh don't worry about that". After I joined the club it was mentioned that within five years, I would be President, it came true. That was in 1999-2000 and what a great year it was, the club took in 10 new members. The Kennett Country Club room was filling up with new helpers. We started the Kennett High School LEO Club with 82 members on their Charter Night. The late PDG Donn Barber told me right from the start that, "Lions Club is what you make it, and you can go as far as you like". Little did I know at the time that 8 years later I would be the District Governor in 14 P. My first experience on the District Cabinet came when PDG Carol asked me to be the Chairperson for Campaign Sight First II. The program was coming to a successful end in 1998 so my job was to continue to promote and tie up any loose ends. I found that this experience brought me out of my public speaking shyness, and I have not been quiet ever since. My year as District Governor was started in Bangkok Thailand. Needless to say, it was very hot and humid there, but the LCI hosts made sure we were comfortable, most of the time and I did get to ride an Elephant. The IP theme was "Everyday Heroes", and PIP Al Brandel was President. I appreciated my wife, Ruth, accompanying me to every club meeting in our District and everyone was very kind. Anyway, we re-started the West Reading - Wyomissing Lions Club with 21 new Charter members, that year with the help of many 14 P club members and PCC J. T. Binstead (14 M). PDG Carl Gundrum, Jr., was the Club's Guiding Lion for many years and I really appreciate his dedication and help.*

*The year was filled with many club successes and it was an honor to be able to visit each Lions Club in our District to meet the members and learn how each Lions Club does things a little different.*

*My year ended in 2009, in Grand Rapid, MI and our District Pin was voted Honorable Mention (2nd Place) of all the pins in the Lions World. The winner was from Japan and I really tried to acquire one but to no avail.*

*My next Lions journey led me to Youth Exchange Chairperson for 14 P with the Nishio City Lions Club in Japan. What a challenging, however great experience it was to work with the students and families in both countries. We all had some great times with this cultural exchange program for three years.*

*In 2014, I had the honor to serve as the Pennsylvania Lions Liaison and nominated PID Cindy Gregg as International Director. We traveled to Hamburg, Germany for the International Convention, and to witness PID Cindy be inducted into the Lions Club International as Multiple District 14, Director.*

*I am currently the Secretary for the Kennett Square Lions Club, the District 14 P Treasurer and the Lion James E. "Bing" Miller Charitable Foundation Treasurer and still semi-working.*

*Lions Club has given me more than I could ever express in this short write up. I have had the opportunity to travel around the World and meet so many wonderful Lions that I never would have experienced without Lions Club. Thank you PDG Donn for your wonderful advice.*

## 2021 Virtual Camp at PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp

We are happy to announce that Beacon Lodge Camp will be offering Virtual Camp during the 2021 camping season!

We will not let the pandemic stop us from getting together and having fun with our Beacon Lodge family!

Virtual camp will run from July 10 through July 14, for two hours each day, and will replace in-person Camp for the following sessions:

Adults – Transitional Care, Assisted Living, and Hearing Impaired.

Children- Camp ALIVE, Assisted Living, Blind/VI, and ENERGY

The daily schedule will be as follows:

7:45 AM to 9:45 AM – Adult Transitional Care and Assisted Living

10:00 AM to Noon – All Children's sessions

1:00 PM to 3:00 PM – Deaf/Hearing Impaired

For Virtual Camp attendees, the Camp fee will be waived for this year!

What will be required: \$100 Registration Fee, Online Registration Form, Recent photo of camper (so we can recognize their smiling faces), signed Photo/Video Release Form, and a valid email address.

Virtual Camp is online, so an internet-connected device and high-speed internet service (able to stream video) will be needed. Also, if the camper may require assistance, please make sure someone is available to help.

Upon receipt of the above-listed payment and documents, a confirmation email will be sent to the email address provided. Prior to virtual camp, an access link for the first day's session will be emailed to all attendees. Each day a new access link will be emailed for the following day's activities.

We will not require the Medical Form for Virtual Camp, but we do recommend that any camper who has a seizure disorder consult a doctor before enrolling.

### What to Expect

Each day of virtual camp will begin with the National Anthem, flag raising, and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Each day will also have a theme – color of the day, word of the day, hat day, pet day, etc...

Each day may include – Singing and dancing, Storytime, Exercise, Campfire Talks, good hygiene practices, round table discussions for thoughts and comments from campers, and more. There will also be cameo appearances from Itowe, the Camp mascot! We will have arts and crafts as well, but don't worry – you don't have to go shopping! Each registered camper will receive a package in the mail with all the needed supplies, mailed to the address on the registration form.

We are excited about Virtual Camp and are looking forward to reconnecting with all of our beloved campers - old friends, and new!




