

Each box contains small gifts, toys, games, crayons, coloring books and fun activities selected for a specific age and gender.

We are a 'Give Local' project. Thousands of groups, families, and individuals have made and delivered Jared boxes to hospitals in their own communities. Children and their parents are so thankful for these boxes that showcase the importance of play and are filled with well wishes, hope and love.

Jared Box Project Suggested Toy List

Softcover books, cardboard books, rattles, bibs, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, clip-on toys for strollers or cribs, crib mirrors, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, busy boxes, light-up toys, musical toys, Oball toys. Lamaze@, Bright Starts@, and Sassy@ brand toys are great. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for infants.

Toddler (1 to 3)

Softcover books, cardboard books, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, small toys that clip on strollers, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, busy boxes, musical toys, colorful pillowcases, fun socks, chunky crayons, coloring books, flashcards, plastic cars, puppets, soft dolls. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for children under 3.

Be aware of choking hazards.

- Preschool (3 to 5)

Crayons, coloring books, grab-n-go activity kits, reading books, stickers, sticker workbooks, activity books, matchbox cars, NERF or rubber balls, stuffed animals, flashcards, fun socks, small action figures, small dolls, travel size games, Silly Putty, simple puzzles, card games (Go Fish, Old Maid, Memory), colorful pillowcases, dress up Items, farm animal sets, dinosaurs. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for Preschoolers.

Elementary (5 to 8) -

Crayons, markers, colored pencils, pens, coloring books, word searches, activity books, eading books, joke books, matchbox cars, NERF balls, stuffed animals, stickers, Silly Putty, LEGO kits, craft kits, Slinky, travel games (Sorry, Connect 4), hand lotion, colorful pillowcases, reusable water bottle, fun socks, action figures, puzzles, deck of cards, UNO card game.

Other toys that are labeled as suggested for school-aged children.

Tweens & Teens (8 and up)-

Crayons, markers, colored pencils, pens, coloring books, word searches, doodle pads, writing journals, Silly Putty, stuffed animals, card games, LEGO kits, puzzles, brain games, books, magazines, Chapsticke, hand lotion, fun socks, colorful pillowcases, jewelry making kits, craft kits, paint sets, reusable water bottle.

All items must be new. No food items. No tiny items due to choking hazards. No snow globes or glass items that can break. No pencil sharpeners. No bubbles. No holiday items.



REGULATIONS FOR LOPF GRANTS

The mandate and challenge to Lions of Pennsylvania Foundation (LOPF) is to achieve significant humanitarian results, particularly those relating to sensory impairment programs within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, with the funds available. All grants authorized should meet the LOPF's major objectives — Humanitarian Services and Vocational Assistance.

Grant request cannot be for more than 50% of the District, Lions Club financial support. The applicant must have secured 50% of the needed income before applying for a grant from the LOPF. The club can raise funds as part of the 50%.

GRANTS

- Humanitarian Service Grants: These grants may be issued for permanent communal programs or institutes, which satisfy humanitarian needs in harmony with the objectives of Lionism.
- 2. <u>Vocational Assistance Grants</u>: These grants may be issued for programs meeting a broad range of educational and training programs that provide a means for sensory impaired people to become self-supporting or to improve upon their economic and social well-being. Funds shall not be granted directly to individuals for such purposes.

LOPF sponsors activities that further reconstruction efforts, and that provide long-term benefits to as many sensory people as possible. Among proposed reconstruction projects, higher priority is given to those proposing the creation or reconstruction of new public facilities and services that benefit the sensory impaired.

CRITERIA FOR GRANTS:

- Grants shall be authorized for projects meeting diverse human needs not adequately addressed by
 other programs, having a district Lions identification and character, and providing long-term
 benefits. Projects serving many people shall be preferred because of more favorable cost
 effectiveness, economics of scale, and lower costs per amount of service.
- LOPF does not provide assistance to offer services otherwise available through governmental, religious, charitable, social, welfare, or comparable service programs. Nor does it attempt to fund projects more appropriately the responsibility of Lions Clubs, Districts, or other Lions units.
- Grant Funds shall concern the financial burden of projects, which are beyond the scope of traditional Lions Club and/or District Fund-raising.
- 4. Projects shall be preferred that have high implicit promotional value.
- 5. Where grants are authorized for projects of a permanent nature, such projects shall carry a definite identification, as having been made possible through LOPF specifications, for such identification shall be provided by LOPF. Documentation of identification shall be included in the final report on the project to be submitted by the District.
- Where grants are approved for a single project, no further grants will be permitted to cover continuing operating expenses.
- 7. Because of limited resources, grants shall not be made on a continuing basis to any single project.
- 8. Grants may NOT be made to meet operating, maintenance, payroll, labor or in-kind labor expenses.
- 9. Grants may be authorized for non-Lions organizations or programs only when their services and facilities would significantly contribute to LOPF purposes, and when their specific capabilities, resources, economics, and efficiency exceed those of available Lions programs. The LOPF grant must represent a significant addition to such program's service capacity. These grant applications must go through and have the financial support of a District or Lions Club.
- 10. Applicant Lions Districts, and/or Clubs, upon the certification of the District Governor and sitting District Director, must not only indicate the nature and extent of their planned participation in the grant project, they must also make significant financial commitment on behalf of the project.
- 11. Each grant application shall be judged solely on its own merit and the degree to which it meets these criteria and the operating policies of LOPF, as established by the Board of Directors.

The need for LOPF assistance must be documented by the submission, on a LOPF Grant Application form, of specific project plans and benefits, a project budget, and all other pertinent factors that may be requested by the Board of Directors. The project budget should clearly detail all project income and expenses, including allocations by item and detail. It should show all sources of income and expense, both received and projected. Project expense should equal project income.

- 2. Grant proposals may originate from any District or Lion organization. An application received must bear the District Governor's, and sitting board members of said District, signatures certifying the significance of the need addressed, the social value and operational feasibility of the proposed project, and the validity and reasonableness of the Grant Request. The certification of the Cabinet, or the Council of Governors in the case of a multiple district application, is also required. Cabinet or Council certification is to be evidenced by the submission of the minutes of the meeting at which the application was certified.
- 3. Any club project must have the full support, including financial support, of the District or a Lions Club, before its application may be eligible for consideration by the Directors. The amount of District/Club financial support must be indicated in the sources of income of the itemized budget. The Lions organization must make a 50% financial commitment on behalf of the project consistent with their respective funding capacity. The financial support comes from the District, Lions Club and other outside sources of revenue.
- LOPF grant funds are intended for projects in the developmental stages, or for projects in progress. LOPF grant funds are not intended to repay loans or to establish reserve funds.
- 5. Grants issued to Lions Clubs or Districts will be made payable to the appropriate Lions Club or District (single, sub, or multiple). Such grants are to be approved by the District Governor or multiple district Council Chairperson who is in office at the time, the district board member and final approval is made by the Board of Directors. The grant sponsor is responsible to disburse and account for LOPF grant funds in his/her possession.
- Lions and/or their families should not receive direct or professional benefit or have proprietary interest in projects receiving LOPF assistance.
- 7. Grant applications should be received by the Executive Director, in completed form with documentation, at least 30 days before a scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors, in order to be placed on the agenda for consideration by the Directors. In case of emergency an exception to this regulation an exemption may be made by the President or Executive Director.
- 8. Applicants failing to answer correspondence concerning their pending application shall be notified 120 days from the date of the last correspondence that their application will be automatically withdrawn, unless a response is received within 60 days starting with the date on the notice. This is the responsibility of the board member.
- New applications for previously withdrawn or rejected projects may be submitted if there is reason to believe the project or the existing conditions are now such that the application is likely to be approved.
- 10. Applications will not be considered that request LOPF assistance in excess of 50% of the total project budget.
- 11. Grant recipients are responsible for submission of a thorough report upon completion of their project within 30 days of the project being completed. An appropriate form will be provided to the designated administrator at the time a grant is made. The report form will request details concerning the results of the project, and in particular, information concerning the exact use of funds made available through LOPF. Where feasible, the report should include photographs, newspaper clippings, and other documentation of work completed. An applicant failing to submit such a report will not be eligible to receive additional grants if there is a final report due in that District. This report should be sent to the Executive Director of the Foundation. The Executive Director will send a notification 30 days prior to the completion date on the grant application.
- 12. Grants for Vision Screening (Kids Sight projects) instruments are limited to a \$2000.00 grant due to the number of potential grants. The Vision Screening grants are awarded only to Districts.
- 13. Grants for water fountains will be limited to \$2,000.
- 14. Grants for Vehicles, for each Vision Impaired Organizations, are limited to one grant every three (3) years. These grants are limited to a \$10,000 grant due to the number of potential grants. The LOPF has the option to determine need if more than one vehicle grant is received per period depending on finances available.
- 15. LOPF grants may be approved only for projects benefiting Pennsylvanians.

The board will review one grant per district. Any additional grants from the district will be reviewed if funds are still available.







Spaatz was the first chief of staff of the U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C General Spaatz was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, Distinguished Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross and Bronze Star Medal. He also has the Mexican Interior Campaign ribbon, the World War I ribbon with three battle stars, the pre-Pearl Harbor ribbon with star, the European Theater ribbon with six stars, the Pacific Theater ribbons, the American Theater ribbon, and the World War II Victory ribbon. His foreign honors include a Grand Officer of the French Legion of Honor, the French Croix de Guerre with Palm, a Grand Commander of the British Empire, Russia's Second Order of Suvoroy and Poland's Polonia Restituta, Commander's Cross with Star
