It's been 13 years since we have established the KidSight Program as my District Governor Project with the help from a group of dedicated lions and a very generous donation from the Coventry Lions club. Over the years we have screened over 39,000 children in Berks and Chester County.

We recently purchased three new cameras with printers to replace the original equipment purchased in 2011. This investment of \$28,000 in new and updated equipment and our screening trailer will enable KidSight to continue in its mission.

This past year we screened a total of 2599 children with 313 referrals. The last three years due to COVID and the loss of two key Board Members (one being **Berks County Screening Coordinator**) the screening totals for Berks County have been on the decline.

KidSight needs to find a Lion to fill the position of **Screening Coordinator for Berks County**. The duty of the coordinator is to help find new opportunities for screening and communicate with the clubs in Berks County. If you are interested in being part of the KidSight Family, please contact me to discuss in detail the duties and time requirements of the coordinator.

Ask Fabrício Oliveira about his native Brazil, and he'll tell you it's the lungs of the world. An evergreen canopy rimmed in turquoise shoreline. He's from a small municipality there, the son of fabric merchants with entrepreneurial vigor in their blood.

By age 18, Fabrício was already part of the family business. He would focus on his studies during the week and travel dutifully for work over the weekends. For such a young man, Fabrício was driven and focused on results.

"I've always done things early," he recalls with a smile.

At just 22 years old, the spirited entrepreneur became a happily married man. He and his wife Amariles had both grown up in the village of Catolé do Rocha, where, despite the region's tropical climate, Fabrício Oliveira was proving to be a man for all seasons.

He was already having professional success—he had a number of business deals under his belt and more on the table. He was experiencing civic success—he had received several appointments to public office. Yet, something was missing for Fabrício.

Until one evening in 1985.

At the time, Fabrício and Amariles were part of a group of friends who would gather on weekends for different social events. Some of these friends were already Lions members and before long, they asked the Oliveiras to join their local club.

"We couldn't say no," he admits. "These were our close friends. And I saw something special in Lions, and an opportunity to give back to the community that had been so good to me."

It was a gesture as simple as an invitation that brought Fabrício Oliveira and his wife to Lions, once and for all.

"So I became a Lion. And that's how everything started," Fabrício recounts.

The call had been answered. A commitment to service set in motion. Now, it was time for the man from Catolé do Rocha to take what he'd learned so far from life and apply it to a new kind of work. His work as a Lion.

Lions All,

In accordance with Multiple District 14 House of Delegates Procedures, Past International President, Joseph L. Wroblewski, and members of the MD-14 International Family announced Saturday, August 3, 2024 as part of the first 2024-2025 PA State Council of Lions Clubs Council of Governors meeting the Multiple District is eligible to endorse a candidate for the office of International Director at the 107th annual Lions Clubs International Convention in Mexico City, Mexico.

PIP Wroblewski and the PA International Family subsequently requested, and members of the Council of Governors approve, the convening of a House of Delegates session for the purpose of selecting an endorsed candidate for this high office. PIP Wroblewski and the PA International Family also requested and were granted approval by the Council of Governors to hold a special election to determine the Multiple District's officially endorsed candidate for the office of International Director.

Each member of the 2024-2025 PA State Council of Lions Clubs Council of Governors is respectfully requested to include notice of the MD's intent to run a candidate for the office of International Director in their district newsletter, on the district website and through other correspondence with clubs and Post District Governors within their district.

The House of Delegates session will convene at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 1, 2025, as part of the third 2024-2025 State Council meeting at the Red Lion Hotel, 4751 Lindle Road, Harrisburg, PA.

The special election will be held Saturday, May 3, 2025, as part of the fourth 2024-2025 State Council meetings at the Scranton Hilton, 100 Adams Avenue, Scranton, PA.

Any MD-14 Lion in good standing in a club in good standing with Lions Clubs International, Multiple District 14 and their sub-district is eligible to be a candidate for the office of International Director.

In accordance with Lions Clubs International Bylaws Article II Section 3, paragraphs a, b, c and Multiple District 14 Bylaws Article 7, Sections 1-8 and the MD-14 House of Delegates Procedure Revised 7-11-2024.

Lions interested in being considered as a candidate for the office of International Director must prepare a Letter of Intent and Lions resume in printed form and present those documents to his/her club's Board of Directors for the purpose of receiving the club's official endorsement. Likewise, all interested candidates are asked to submit a Letter of Intent and Lions resume to the PA State Council of Lions Clubs office, 949 East Park Drive, Harrisburg, PA 17111 prior to October 1, 2024.

After receiving the club's endorsement, those documents must be forwarded to the candidate's District Governor for approval by the sub-district's delegates at a special election called for the purpose of providing the sub-district's endorsement of the candidate.

The letters of endorsement from both the club and sub-district must be dated and signed by the appropriate club and sub-district officers and presented in written form to the State Office, Attn: State Administrator by October 13, 2024.

The state of PA is looking for an International director. It will be a fast moving process as you can see it the letter attached. There are three of you who are in the house delegates that should plan to be at the Red Lion Hotel on Feb 1 to vote. That would be **PDG Phil Shoher, PDG Rich Taylor, IPDG Gary Hilbert**

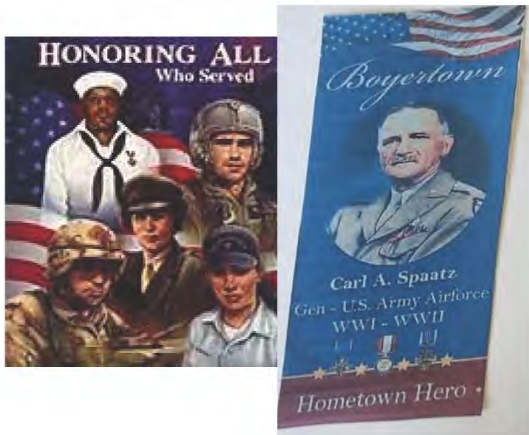
