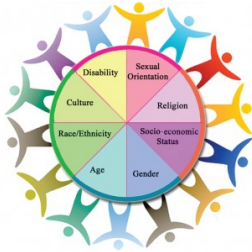

Leader Dog and Lions: Celebrating our 80 Year Partnership



In 1938, Lions Charles A. Nutting, Donald P. Schurr and S.A. Dodge (*pictured above*) established a guide dog school for people who are blind.

On October 8, 1939, the first class of the official Lions Leader Dog Foundation graduated. The cost to graduate a client/dog team was \$600.

Leader Dog's global ties to the Lions strengthened in 1953 when S.A. Dodge served as president of Lions International, bringing Leader Dog to the Lions at the highest level. Melvin Jones gave Leader Dog his personal endorsement in 1958.

In April 2013, LION Magazine listed Leader Dog as one of the "10 Brilliant Breakthroughs in Service."

Lions throughout the world continue to support Leader Dog financially, refer people who need assistance and serve on the Board of Trustees. Lions are puppy raisers, volunteers, breeding hosts and more. Many Leader Dog recipients become Lions after experiencing Lions support and mission firsthand.

Today, the Lions' mission, "We serve," perfectly complements the Leader Dog mission of empowering people who are blind or visually impaired with lifelong skills for safe and independent daily travel.

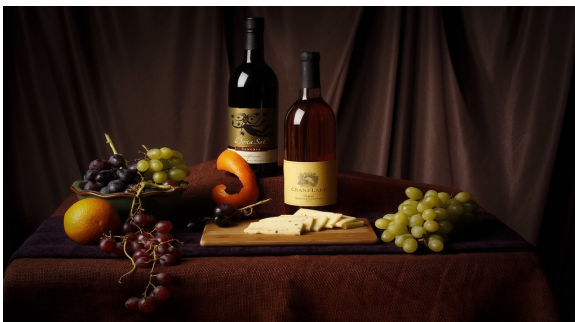
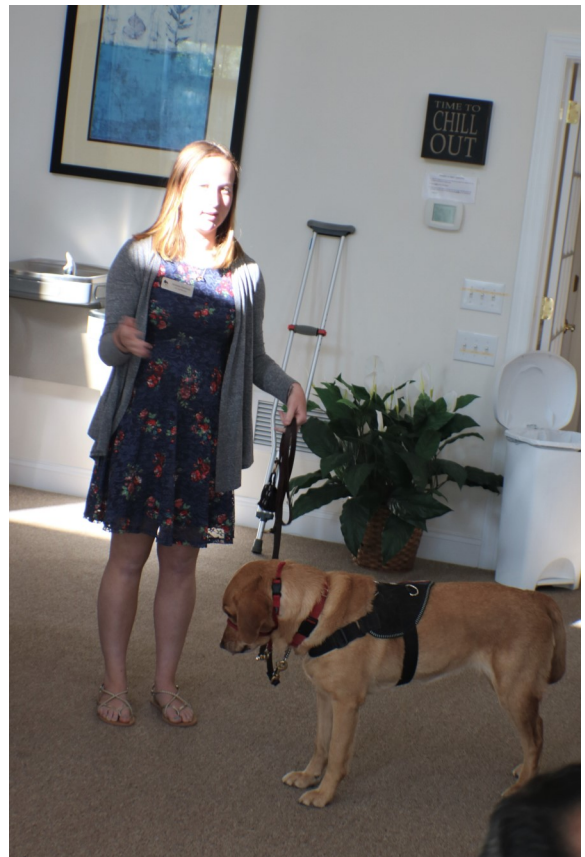


Avon Grove Lions
