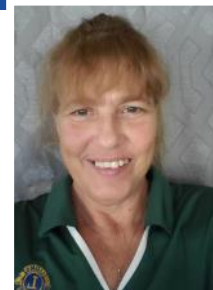

As we begin to get past the lock down required by the pandemic and you begin to meet again in person as a club, I ask that you consider these Global Membership Approach (GMA) goals. The goals are:

- *Re-motivate Members with Exciting Service Opportunities*
- *Develop and support club and district leaders*

Not more than three years ago, my own club, Longswamp, was in dire need of resurgence in membership due to the advanced age of our membership and the fact that we had fallen to a low of 10 members. Facing crisis, we began an aggressive campaign to recruit new members and ensure they were immediately engaged in club activities once we convinced them to join. We rose quickly to a current strength of twenty-one! We are very active and have conducted both our first annual car cruise and first annual car show in the past year. Very exciting times for us!

Lions Clubs International Foundation

A big thank you for your donations to LCIF during the 2020 to 2021 Lions year.

In my report for the May meeting of our District 14P cabinet, I said that 22 of our 39 district Lions Clubs had contributed or pledged slightly more than \$13,000 to our foundation in the current year. I reported that this was less than the 25 clubs that contributed over \$18,500 during the previous year.

The year end report as of June 30th shows that our district had a good fourth quarter and ended the 2020 to 2021 year with 25 of our 39 Lions Clubs participating by contributing a total of \$20,602.25 to our foundation during the year. This is the same number of clubs that contributed during the previous year, but is over \$2000 above the \$18,525.16 that our District 14p clubs gave in 2019 to 2020.

In a mid-July email newsletter from our Campaign 100 Chairperson, PIP Dr. Jitsuhiro Yamada, it was reported that we have received \$213,293,415 toward our worldwide goal of 300 million dollars. We are now in the last year of our capital campaign and need to keep pushing to reach our goal in order to fund grants in all of our expanded global causes of vision, hunger relief, diabetes awareness, environment, and childhood cancer relief, along with serving our youth. Please continue to contribute to LCIF and maybe have a club fundraiser dedicated to raising money for our foundation.

In the same email newsletter I referenced above, it was reported that 1200 grants were awarded during 2020 to 2021 for a total of \$33,549,260. Our foundation continues to "fill our world in need with hope", and deserves our support.

In a final request, if your Lions Club has not named a club LCIF coordinator on your list of officers in LCI, I encourage you to do so. Otherwise, I will be sending information to last year's club president. But I would like to see each club have a member who is willing to promote LCIF within the club. This is especially important as we go through this final year of the campaign.

Again, thank you for your contributions during the last year and keep up the good work.

I hope to get back to visiting our District Lions Clubs in September.

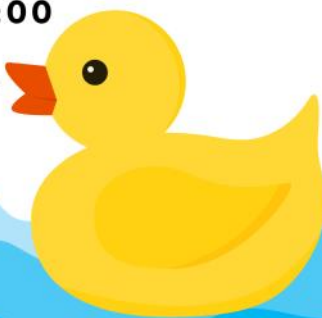

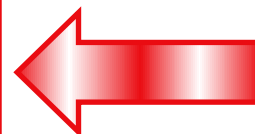


